advertise positions**

Esquering Council has decided to follow the lead of other municipalities and advertise for interested persons to serve on the township's various boards and committees.

As a result, only the regular council appointments were finalized at last Wednesday's inaugural meeting.

Reeve Tom Hill, Deputy-reeve Len Cox, and Councillor Wilfrid Leslie were named to serve on the Georgetown fire area committee. Reeve Hill and fresh-man Councillor George Maltby will represent the township on the Acton fire area committee and Councillor Dick Howitt will retain his seat on the Milton fire area committee.

Re-appointments

Re-appointments included Reeve Hill as Esquering representative on the Credit Valley Conservation Authority and Deputy-reeve Cox as representative on the Halton Region Conservation Authority. Councillor Maltby was chosen to represent council on the Ballinacree Community Hall board.

Applications are now being accepted from interested rate-payers for two positions on committee of adjustment, Georgetown District Memorial Hospital board representative, two positions on the township library board, Halton County

Museum board representative, two positions on township planning board, and three positions on Hornby ball park committee.

Reject suggestion

Council rejected a suggestion by clerk-treasurer Delmar French that an extra councillor be appointed to planning board instead of a ratepayer. Councillor Howitt said he had mixed feelings about the suggestion and Reeve Hill said he felt it would be better to retain the present appointment system.
