The P.L.R. "Sockets", Milton's entry in the Tri-County Mite league played to a 2-2 tie with Georgetown on Wednesday night in Milton. The Sockets went a head 1-0 on a goal by Doug Riding with Paul Benton assisting. Georgetown fought right back and scored two goals to take a two goal lead which they held until late in the third period. Dean Swance notched the tying goal on a solo effort with two minutes to go in the game. Derrick Neelands played one of his best games of the season in the nets for the Sockets. Coach Ken Thompson noted this game was a real team effort as the last time these two clubs met, Georgetown skated off with a 4-1 win. The Sockets see action on Thursday night at 7 p.m. against Chinguacousy at Ernscliffe Arena.

Jrs. miss playoffs for the first time

For the first time since Milton first sponsored a Junior hockey team nine years ago, the town's representatives won't be in playoff contention. Milton Continental Flyers, who lost two weekend encounters to Streetsville Derbys on Friday and Oakville Blades on Sunday, have now been eliminated from any chance of gaining a playoff berth. Flyers fell behind Streetsville 2-1 in the first period, 7-5 at the end of the second and lost 9-6 in the final analysis. The game was a hard hitting contest that saw 87 minutes in penalties called, 50 to the Streetsville club and 37 to the locals.

Only fight
Gary Hunt and Tom Smith took part in the only scuffle of the contest. Hunt took five minutes for fighting and Smith took a double minor for cross checking and holding. Executive member Bob Bartlett was called to keep the peace in the penalty box when it appeared tempers were hot. Soon after that outburst trouble broke out in the stands directly behind the Milton players' bench. It appeared that spare goaltender Terry Mastine had found himself engaged in heated dialogue with spectators. Mark McKenzie joined Mastine and fists began to fly.

When the players returned to the bench fans continued to push and shove one another. It appeared for a while that a full scale fracas could break out but tempers levelled off and action resumed without any further disturbances. John Arnold opened the scoring for Milton with the only first period goal. John Tonelli, Tom Fendley, John Rusk and Bob Fukunoto all scored second period goals while Tonelli scored his second goal of the game and the only Milton goal of the third period. Tonelli, Ray Love, Tom Fendley and George Mills all assisted twice while John Arnold, Gary Hunt and Dan Nichols picked up one assist each.

Three goals
Aidan Flatley led Streetsville shooters with three goals while Brian Dawes fired a pair and singles went to John Sands, Kevin Grossman, Dave Watts and John Campbell. Flyers never recovered from Oakville's early lead Sunday.

Brian Bennett opened the scoring just one minute and 35 seconds after the opening face off. He scored his second goal later in the same period while Mark Cassidy and Ray Chisholm added singles. Bennett rounded out his hat trick in the second period and a goal by Tom Gibbons put the Blades ahead of Milton by a 6-3 margin at the end of the second. Chris Steinhof scored Oakville's only other goal of the game. Craig Fleming, Doug Anderson, Bob Fukunoto and Ray Love all singled for Flyers while the locals got assists from John Arnold, Gary Hunt, John Tonelli and Ivan Durigon. Flyers host Preston Friday in the last home game of the season and finish the season off in Burlington Sunday.
