Milton Continental Flyers, who lost two weekend encounters Streetsville Derbies on Friday and Oakville Blades on Sunday, have now been eliminated from any chance of gaining a playoff

Flyers fell behind Streetsville 2-1 in the first period, 7-5 at the end of the second and lost 9-6 in the final analysis.
