Maplehurst sod turning ceremony here Friday

Construction of the new \$13½ million Maplehurst Correctional Facilities for Adult Offenders in Milton will be marked by an official ground-breaking ceremony to take place on the site at 11 a.m. this Friday, Feb. 9.

Officiating at the sod-turning will be the Hon. James W. Snow, Minister of Government Services and MPP for Halton East, and the Hon. C. J. S. Apps, Minister of Correctional Services.

Dignitaries on hand

Dignitaries will include Mayor Brian Best and members of the Council of the Town of Milton, and members of the Milton

Planning Board. Also participating will be representatives from Dunlop Farrow Aitken, associate architects working on the project, and Janin Building and Civil Works Limited, the construction management contractors.

On completion, which is expected in 1974, the facilities will comprise an adult correctional centre and an adult training centre, each with a capacity of 200 persons. Maplehurst will eventually replace the outdated facilities at Mimico Correctional Centre and help to reduce the population at Guelph Correctional Centre.

Garage, contents lost owner rescues his car

A cement block garage was heavily damaged and some of its contents lost by an early morning fire Thursday at the Five Side-road residence of Jack Dewhurst, near Campbellville.

Milton Firefighters responded to the 7:20 a.m. alarm but the blaze was well underway when they arrived. Mr. Dewhurst managed to get his car out of the garage but some welding equipment, lawn furniture, a bench saw, tools and other goods stored in the garage were burned. Fire Chief A. E. Clement said he assumes a small stove caused the blaze. It was a chilly morning

and Mrs. Dewhurst served coffee and food to the firefighters.

Obstetrics clinic here

Dr. Sidney B. Effer, Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the McMaster University Medical Centre, will be presiding over a one-day clinic at the Milton District Hospital on Feb. 21. This clinic is being arranged and sponsored by the Toronto-based Ontario Medical Foundation as part of its on-going program of continuing medical education aimed at providing equality of educational opportunity for all physicians practicing in Ontario.

Milton District Hospital is one of over 80 Class "C" hospitals (those general hospitals having fewer than 100 beds) in the province that are eligible for the Foundation's continuing medical education program in the areas of anesthesiology, internal medicine, pediatrics, obstetrics, and surgery. Most of these hospitals have in the past tended to be somewhat isolated from the mainstream of similar educational arrangements being set up by the five medical schools in the province.

Dr. Effer's clinic will deal with "high risk pregnancies". Dr. D. H. Aikenhead, chief of obstetrics and gynecology at the local hospital, is co-ordinating the program.
