The Milton Mustangs won the East Halton County hockey league title Monday by defeating Perdue and moving into first place. They were awarded the East Halton League trophy, emblematic of their first place finish in the league during the regular playing season.

The Mustangs have enjoyed a very good season of hockey. They registered seven wins, two ties, and one loss.

In starting the season coaches commented it was quite hard choosing the team because "those who showed up for the team were pretty equal in calibre."

The team started the season off right last Nov. 8 when they defeated General Wolfe 9-3. They

went on to defeat Oakville-Trafalgar 6-5, Nov. 13. On Nov. 22 they tied Oakville-Trafalgar. The next week they defeated Perdue 2-0 and Blakelock 8-6. Then began their five week layoff which resulted in their first and only loss.

On Jan. 8 they tied White Oaks 3-3 and on Wednesday of that week they lost to Blakelock 4-1. One week later they moved out of their slump and defeated White Oaks 6-2. The following Monday they defeated General Wolfe, in the highest scoring game of the season, 11-2. After a three week layoff they tied Blakelock 3-3 in an exhibition game. Then Monday they went on to win the league title by trouncing Perdue 6-1.

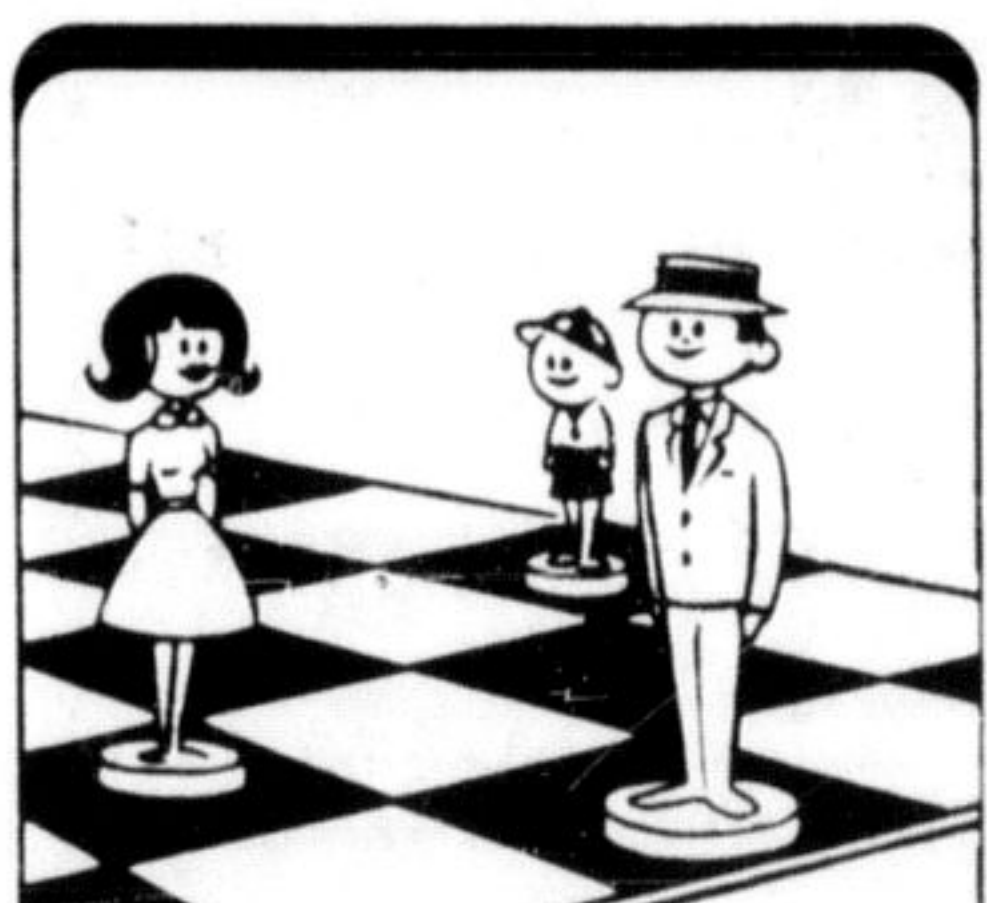

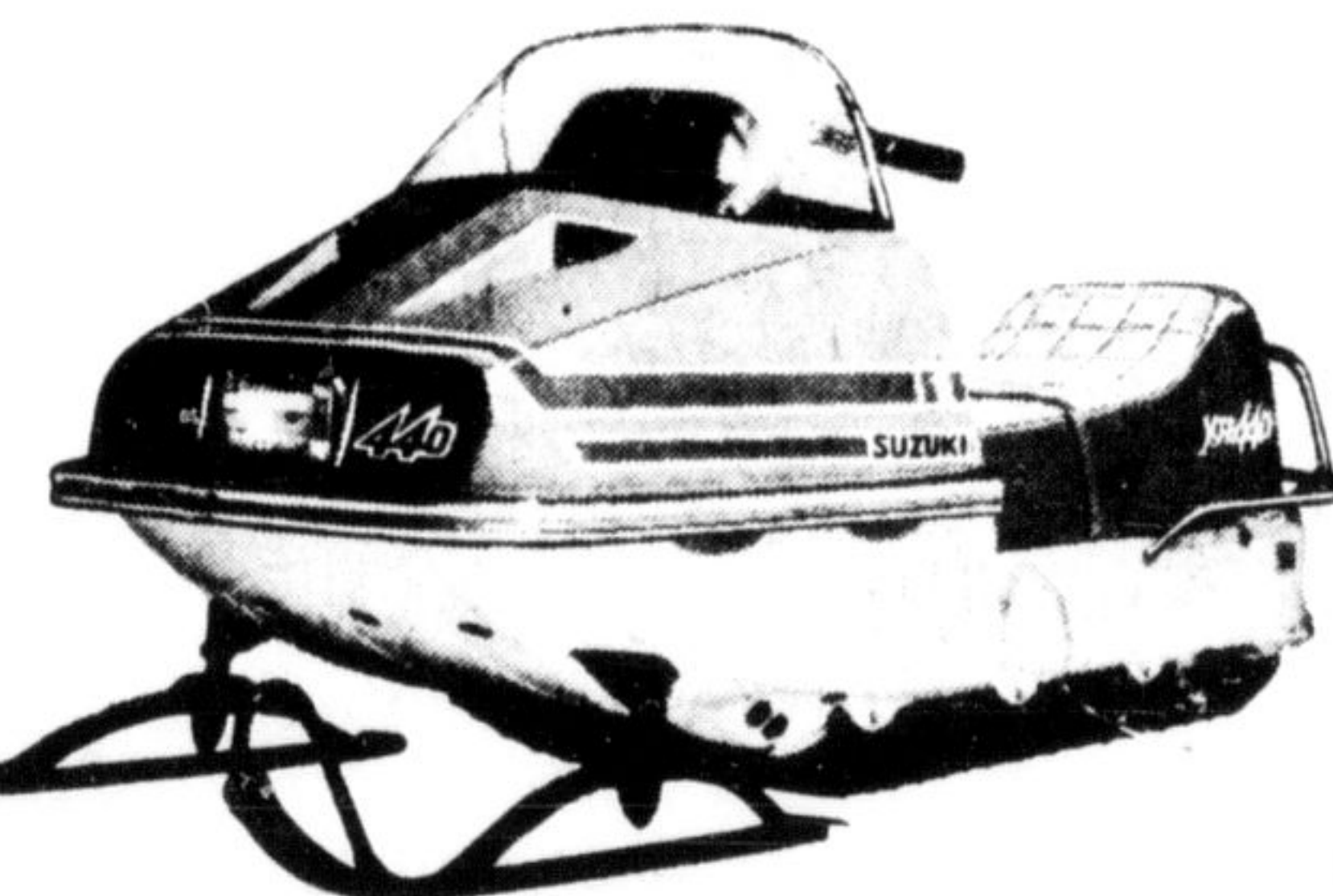
