Propose contest to design office

Halton Region Conservation Authority will investigate the possibility of holding a contest among architects in order to come up with a design for the new building at Kelso to house HRCA administrators and staff.

The authority had earlier considered a committee recommendation to engage **Roscoe and Stienstra, Architects** at a cost of \$3,150 to provide a preliminary design. That motion was rescinded to allow the competition.

Terry Mannell had suggested the competition would not save any money but would allow the authority to see different designs.

Oppose purchase
According to committee minutes from the Land Use Advisory Board, member **R. B. Day** and two others had opposed the purchase of a new building. Day argued that purchase of lakefront and escarpment properties should rate higher priority than a new office and he wondered if funds would be provided by the province for such accommodation.

While the estimated cost of the building now stands at \$180,000 Day predicted costs would reach \$250,000. **Manager Murray Stephen** said there would be an advantage to consolidate HRCA offices and have them under one roof. The authority currently rents 1,800 square feet on Main St. in Milton at \$585 per month and pays for its own janitorial services as well as water and hydro.

According to minutes from the Land Use Advisory Board, members discussed the Kelso site as the location of the Authority

office which has been approved by the authority as to its convenience and accessibility to the general public. "It was felt that the only people inconvenienced would be the people of the Town of Milton and that the majority of the people who have business with the authority are from outside the town."

Will call tenders for new bridge

Tenders will be called next week by the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for the construction of the new **Credit River Bridge** on Highway 7 in the Village of Norval, MPP **Jim Snow** announced.

Contract will include, in addition to the New Bridge, a truck climbing lane for a distance of 1.2 miles and also a retaining wall at the **Credit River Bridge**.

It is anticipated the contract will proceed for construction in the early Spring of 1973.

Friday game decides high school champions

Only one goal
On Friday things got tougher although Milton was playing on home ice. **John Volpe** scored the only goal throughout the game at 9:40 of the third period. He was assisted by **Carl Barker** and **Steve McCann**.

The Milton game also proved to be rough. During the game a Milton fan strung up a dummy

which was supposed to represent a **Blakelock** player. The dummy wore a **Blakelock** crest on its sweater. Just before the end of the game a Milton fan grabbed the dummy, started tearing it to pieces and tossing it towards the ice. This provoked the **Blakelock** fans and a scuffle began.

One fan commented, "Blakelock must have resented a dummy, representing one of their players, hanging in a noose." There were only a minority of the fans fighting but most of the remainder of the crowd was pushing.

After the game **Blakelock** and Milton fans lined up on opposite sides of the road and pelted snowballs at each other. A **Blakelock** student got hit squarely on the nose and had to be helped into the arena for repairs.
