

Hearns nominated for college award

Don Hearns of Milton is one of 13 athletes attending Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute at Troy, N.Y. who has been named as an outstanding college athlete of America. Hearns who topped the scoring for RPI this year was one of three players from the hockey club honored.

Hearns had several successful years of junior hockey under his belt when he joined the RPI club. He played both his minor hockey and junior hockey in Milton.

Athletic directors and coaches from individual colleges and universities across the nation nominated the winning athletes on the basis of their abilities—not only in athletics, but in community and campus activities.

Criteria for those selected as Outstanding College Athletes of America included leadership, service, scholarship and, of course, outstanding athletic accomplishment.

All of the athletes chosen will be eligible for the Outstanding College Athletes of America Hall of Fame Awards Program. Those

selected by the board of advisors will be honored at an awards banquet. The ceremony will be attended by prominent sports figures from all over the United States.

The Hall of Fame will be permanently established in Los Angeles under the auspices of the California Museum of Science and Industry and will serve to honor each year's winning athletes.

The complete biographies and accomplishments of the athletes will be in the annual volume Outstanding College Athletes of America.
