Figures in the 1973 budget show that Esquesing fire area number one takes the largest bite out of total fire costs to the township of \$51,407.83.

The combined Georgetown-Esquesing budget of \$103,200 is

shared on a 62-38 per cent basis with Esquesing's the lesser. Figures are based on the number of fires in the previous three year period which work out to 209 in the town and 127 in the township. Second highest figure in the fire budget is Milton rural fire area

but is reduced by a \$281.51 surplus from 1972 to \$11,074.30. Esquesing pays 39.27 per cent of the total budget of \$15,752.62 in Acton rural fire area number two, which amounts to \$6,186.53.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton deems it advisable to amend By-law Number 31-69, as amended:

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton ENACTS as follows:

1. That Section 6 (15) of By-law Number 31-69 is hereby amended by deleting therefrom, in its entirety, subsection (a) and substituting therefore the following new subsection (a):

(a) REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL USES Where a lot is used for a Non-Residential purpose and the interior side or rear lot line, or portion thereof, abuts a Residential use or undeveloped land in an R or D Zone, then a strip of land adjoining such abutting lot line, or portion thereof, shall be used for no other purpose than a planting strip in accordance with the provisions of this subsection, provided that such planting strip shall not be required:

(i) within 10 feet of a street allowance; and or (ii) where such lot abuts any land in a D Zone which land is designated on the Land Use Plan of the Official Plan in the same basic land use category as the lot in question."

2. This By-law shall become effective on the date hereof subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.

The reason for the amendment is to eliminate financial hardship that may be created by requiring the owner of a parcel of land to provide a planting strip that will not be required when the abutting land is eventually zoned in accordance with the designation contained in the Municipality's Official Plan.
