THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON BY-LAW NO. 9-73 A By-law to amend By-law Number 31-69

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton deems it advisable to amend By-law Number 31-69, as amended:

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton ENACTS as follows:

1. That Section 6 (15) of By-law Number 31-69 is hereby amended by deleting therefrom, in its entirety, subsection (a) and substituting therefore the following new subsection (a):

(a) REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-RESIDENTIAL USES Where a lot is used for a Non-Residential purpose and the interior side or rear lot line, or portion thereof, abuts a Residential use or undeveloped land in an R or D Zone, then a strip of land adjoining such abutting lot line, or portion thereof, shall be used for no other purpose than a planting strip in accordance with the provisions of this subsection, provided that such planting strip shall not be required:

(i) within 10 feet of a street allowance; and or (ii) where such lot abuts any land in a D Zone which land is designated on the Land Use Plan of the Official Plan in the same basic land use category as the lot in question."

2. This By-law shall become effective on the date hereof subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON BY-LAW NO. 9-73

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This By-law will amend the existing Restricted Area By-law of the Milton Planning Area, being the Zoning By-law of the Town of Milton, By-law No. 31-69, as amended.

By-Law 31-69 presently provides:

Section 6 (15) (a) - "Where a lot is used for a Non-Residential purpose and the interior side or rear lot line, or portion thereof, abuts a Residential use or undeveloped land in an R or D Zone, then a strip of land adjoining such abutting lot line, or portion thereof, shall be used for no other purpose than a planting strip in accordance with the provisions of this subsection provided that such planting strip shall not be required within 10 feet of a street allowance." (Amended by B / L 5-70).


