Milton man will lead medical team

Dr. Matthew Fitch of Milton has been chosen to lead a team of medical people from Canada which will embark upon a two year program in public health in the Republic of Cameroun in Africa.

The program is operated under the auspices of the Canadian International Development Agency which is best described as an extension of the department of external affairs.

The public health team Dr. Fitch will lead will include one other doctor, a public health nurse, a medical sociologist, a health educator, a nutritionist, a lab technician and an environmental engineer.

Dr. Fitch said the team would serve in a dual capacity, assisting in the teaching of doctors there as well as setting up a health unit. The health unit would be set up in the underdeveloped part of the Cameroun and the university at which doctors train is established in the capital of the Cameroun, Yaounde.

Bilingual
Because part of the Cameroun speaks French and another part English, the members of the team will be bilingual. Dr. Fitch, now employed by the provincial government, has spent most of his life in the public health field.

The Cameroun project will lead Dr. Fitch and the team to work with diseases uncommon in Canada. Diseases such as malaria and leprosy are more common there because of the climate and poverty in some areas, he said.

Constantly warm
In Yaounde the temperature stays for the better part between 70 and 80 degrees, usually dropping from about 80 in the daytime to 70 at night. On the coast however, temperatures of 100 are common. Yaounde is situated just four degrees north of the equator.

Yaounde, a city of about 90,000 has a mix of some modern

buildings along with poor places and some hut-like structures.

Dr. and Mrs. Fitch will leave for Africa July 10. Their youngest son and daughter are expected to spend the summer with them and then leave for university and schools elsewhere, while the two oldest sons are expected to visit during their stay there.

Ask relief

Treasurers from Halton municipalities will meet June 6 to discuss Nassagaweya township's appeal of their educational levy.

The board of arbitrators, which is made up of municipal treasurers agreed at their last meeting that figures would be worked out on the same formula as last year.

The township was awarded close to \$50,000 last year as a result of the appeal. Milton treasurer Audrey Brush indicated the award would likely be in the same neighborhood this year if the board agreed on the decision.
