Elizabeth Robson is a lawyer, having graduated from Osgoode Law School in 1949. She is the town solicitor for Burlington, a post she has held since 1967. She is very concerned about the regional government implementation this year.

Miss Robson said she expects competition in her bid to become the first woman president of the Halton Liberals and is actively campaigning among the nearly 1,000 eligible members of the Association.
