#### Milton Planning Board briefs

At a meeting of Milton Planning Board last week the board: —Learned council had approved with some reservations a plan of subdivision for Victoria Wood developers in neighborhood number four in the southern part of the municipality.

—Was advised Milton council had agreed to rezone a property at 224 Martin St. to allow a vacant dentist's office to be converted and used as a bachelor apartment.

—Learned the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources had advised the matter of fencing around chemical or explosive

plants like Hand Chemical Industries was up to the individual inspector. The letter was responding to a query from Milton Planning Board. It was noted at least 215 feet should be provided between a chemical plant and any other building.

—Was advised a number of public meetings would be held to present proposed alternatives for the 500 KV Hydro Transmission Line from Middleport to Pickering. A meeting will be held in Milton July 3 and a second in Acton July 6. Ten meetings in all will be held.

#### Study public image

Halton County Board of Education considered a number of recommendations made by the Priorities and Expenditures Committee on communications at their meeting Thursday.

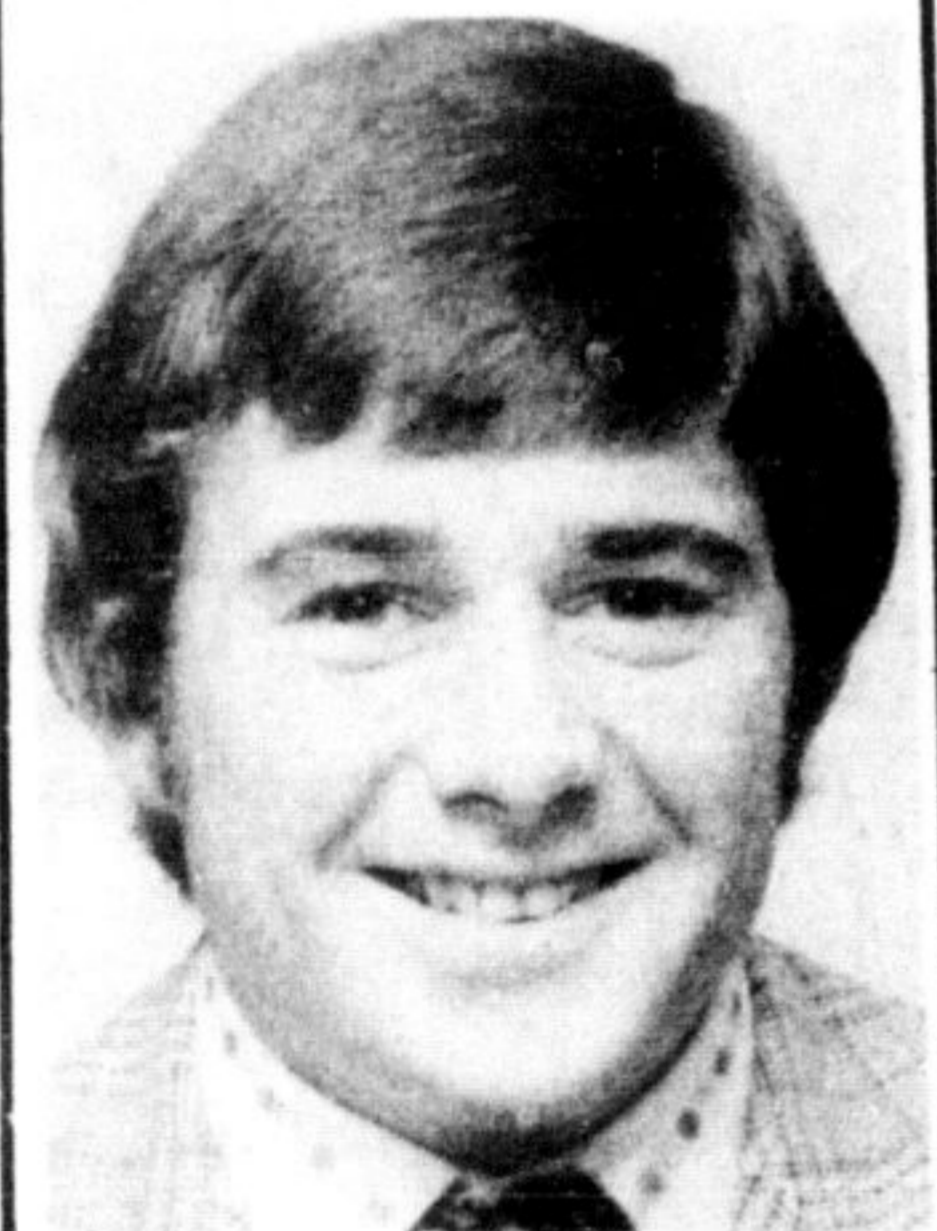
The board agreed that while the newsletter Halton Education News had its shortcomings and some circulation problems, the exercise was worth continuing.

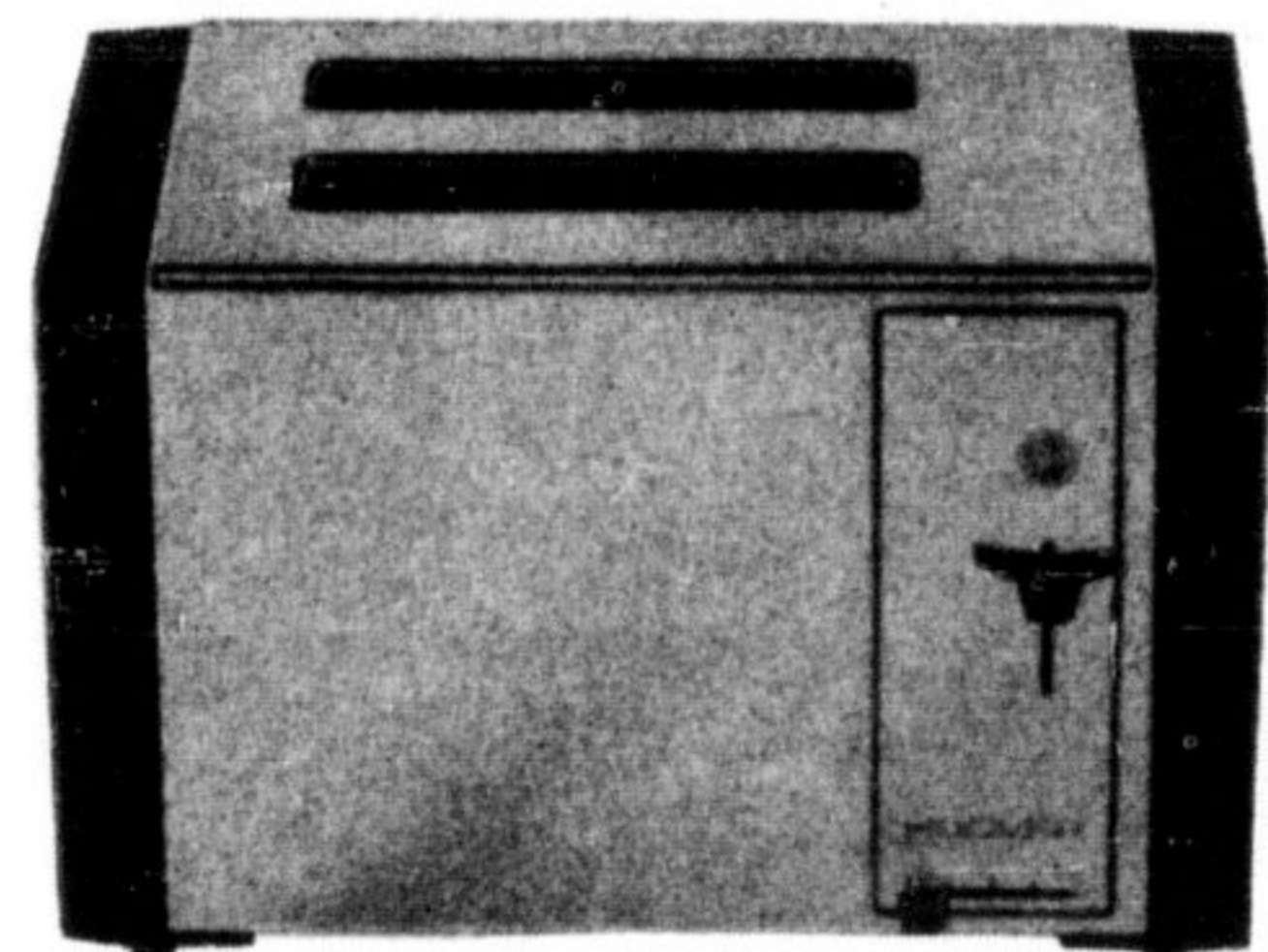
Good PR The board agreed to meet annually with the press and radio station reporters to maintain good relations with the media.
