The Mounties are coming to Milton's Community Day-Dominion Day celebrations on July 1, it was announced this week.

Confirmation was received that representatives of the century old R.C.M.P. would be attending the festivities in Rotary Park, at the invitation of the sponsoring groups.

Workmen are racing to completion on the Community Centre building which has been under construction in Rotary Park, in an effort to have it ready for a grand opening during the July 1 events.

Special stage

The Lorne Scots Band will be on hand for the annual band concert and an outdoor raised stage is being prepared for them to play from, in Rotary Park.

Local entertainers will also be adding their talents to provide afternoon entertainment and members of council and the parks and recreation committee are committed to serve hot dogs and soft drinks at bargain prices.

Two showings are planned of the film Halton County—The Man and the Boy, in the community room included in the new building. Water safety films will

also be screened and some municipal displays are being organized.

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DOMINION HARDWARE**
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Revise by-law

Milton Planning Board should consider revising the town's zoning by-law to allow manufacturing concerns relief from parking restrictions currently in force, Mayor Brian Best said at a board meeting Wednesday.

Mayor Best noted current regulations require industrial firms to provide parking spaces on a square footage basis.

The mayor pointed out instances where as many as 800 parking spaces may have to be provided for about 30 employees in warehouses.

Some members were concerned about the possibility of having a new firm buy the warehouse and use it for a manufacturing purpose that would employ 400 or 500 people and not have sufficient parking space.

Members agreed even warehouses should provide the property for parking but they wouldn't be compelled to pave the entire area if it wasn't needed for employees.

Secretary Ross Pearen was instructed to draw up an amending by-law for the board to consider at the July meeting.
