


Fun for young as well as old

2 p.m.—Scuba diving demonstration in the pool.

2 p.m.-Milton Pee Wees vs. Oakville on the ball diamond.

2.15 p.m.—Canoeing demonstration in the pool.

2.30 p.m.—Free public swimming in the pool until 4.30. Your chance to get in the swim with the whole family.

3 p.m. and 4 p.m.—Film showing of the award winning Halton County Film featuring scenes from the whole county, including Milton. Shown in the community room.

9.15 p.m.—Aerial fireworks display over the Mill Pond, seen best from Centennial Park and the pond bank.
