

## Danish visitor enthusiastic about attending school here

When Milton District High School begins again next week the Grade 13 class will have at least one enthusiastic member. Although she's already completed 13 years of school, Lisbeth Heileson of Denmark jumped at the chance to attend Grade 13 in Canada. She wants to learn more English.

Lisbeth is Milton's visitor in the Rotary Club's international student exchange. And she's beginning her stay in Canada at the home of Gordon Thompson, who is Milton's visiting student in Belgium. She arrived on August 19 and has spent two weeks becoming accustomed to Milton and area. Later in September she

will visit Ottawa and Niagara Falls. After two or three months with the Thompsons she will visit other Rotary members' families for the remainder of her one year visit.

Limited sports  
Besides her courses in English, History and French, Lisbeth is looking forward to taking Physical Education. The wide range of sports activities offered in the girls' program appeal to her since at home in Denmark, students had a very limited choice of sports in which to participate. She also wants to take a typing course because no vocational skills were taught in the Danish gymnasias, or high

schools. Students had to attend business colleges to learn office skills.

Lisbeth hopes to play her clarinet at Milton High School, too.

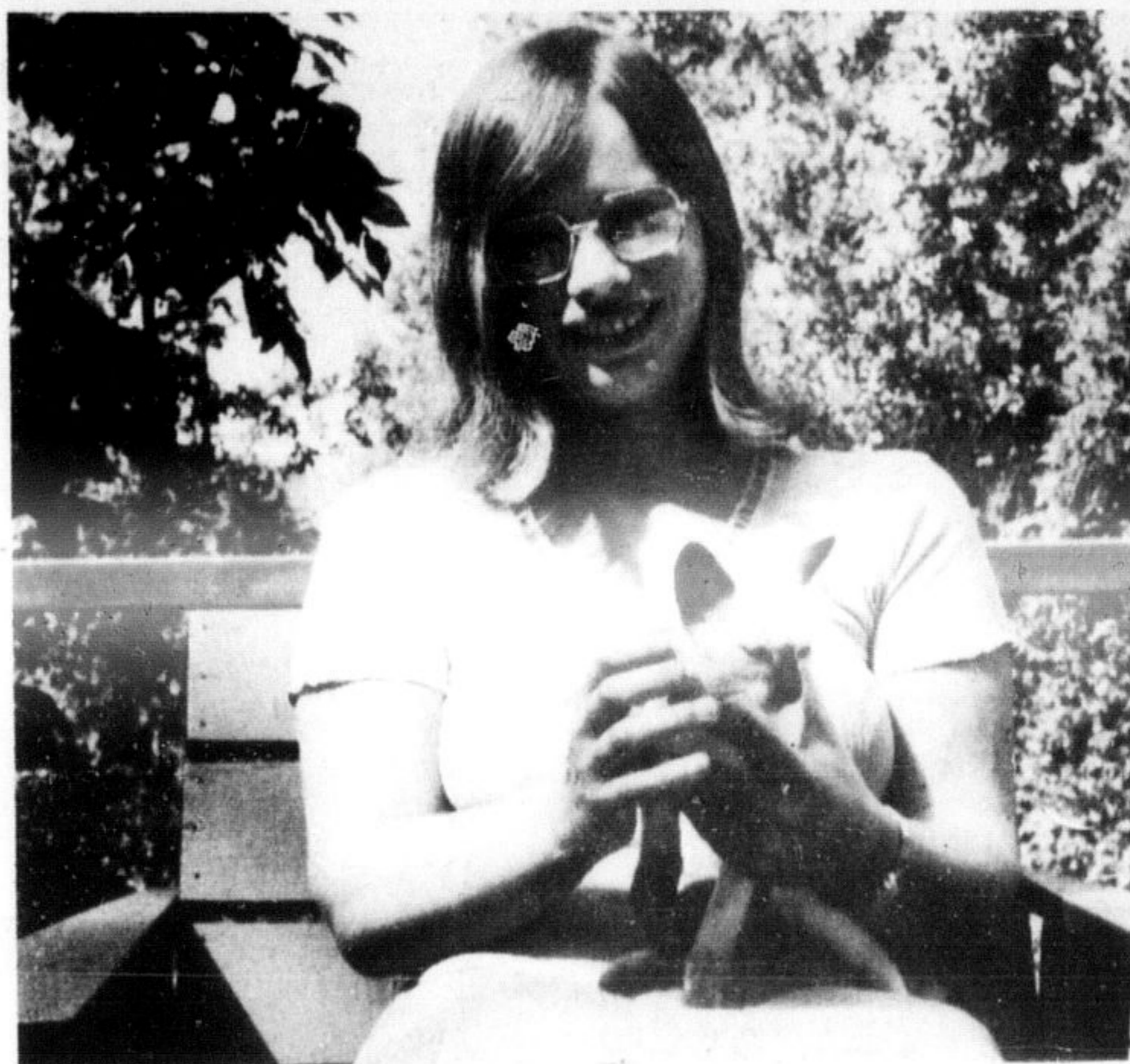
Lisbeth's home is Hovedgaard, in central Denmark, which is a town of 1,200. Her father is regional government chairman, so to speak, being the mayor of a municipal area comprising 10,000 people and 14 other towns besides Lisbeth's home.

Notes differences  
One difference she has noticed is the easy accessibility of consumer goods in Canada. Cars, she says are twice as big here, but

cost about half of the price of a small European car in Denmark. Gas is also very expensive and cigarettes cost two dollars for a package of 20. Canadian meat prices are just beginning to reach normal costs in Denmark—Lisbeth was surprised to see bacon at breakfast. She says Danes don't eat meat in the mornings.

Meanwhile, Gordon Thompson's family is beginning to wonder whether or not he'll come home. His brother Pat, 13, says Gordon wrote and told them he was staying in a house twice the size of his home with a swimming pool and tennis courts "among other things." He's in a small town outside Brussels and near enough to the mountains to go skiing. Pat says his mother just about fainted when she heard where Gordon was.
