Claims twp. needs mobile home park

With the gap between house prices and the financial means of young couples steadily increasing, Esquesing township should consider establishing a municipally-operated mobile home park, Glen Williams resident Harm Koeslag suggested at last week's regular council meeting. The township presently has a bylaw prohibiting any more mobile homes except in Willow Park, Norval, a licensed area.

"Young couples now don't have a chance to get out of an apartment building. They could buy a mobile home at a third the cost of a house' Koeslag told council.

Koeslag said he would like to see a mobile home park run by an organization which is not out to make money and suggested it be established before the regional government takeover.

"There may not be much chance to get it after that", he




