Average \$959 figure at Brown dispersal

The Browdale Dispersal Sale of Holstein cattle, held Sept. 14 for owner James W. Brown, Milton realized an average of \$959 for 50 head. The sale total was \$47,950. Abner Martin, Atwood, paid the top price of \$3,550 for a four-year-old female classified Very Good for type and possessing a record of production at two years of age of 13,880 lbs. milk testing 3.84 butterfat for a total of 533 lbs. fat in 305 days. Mountain Scene Myra Myrna is sired by the Class Extra bull Flemingdale Perseus Mark, and her dam, Romandale Re-Echo Myra, is classified Good plus with a record at two years of age with a breed Class Average percent of 142 for milk and 139 for fat. She is carrying a calf sired by Downalane Reflection Emperor.

\$1,800 cow
Other high priced animals at the sale included Mountain Scene Lady Dolly purchased for \$1,800 by Luckholm Holsteins Ltd., Owen Sound. Valentina Farms Ltd., Georgetown, paid \$1,650 for an open heifer; Global Holsteins Ltd., Gormley, paid \$1,400 for a bred heifer; and Robert W. Carter, Blyth, paid \$1,300 for a milking female.

The largest buyers at the sale included Ashmore Farms, Milton, with four animals for a total of \$4,200; Robert W. Carter, Blyth, with three head for a total of \$3,425 and Abner Martin with the top priced animal.

The following is a breakdown of the sale: 34 milking females averaged \$931.18; 15 bred heifers averaged \$971.33; one open yearling at \$1,650; and one baby at \$70.

Guilty plea arson charge

A rash of barn fires across Halton and Wentworth Counties on Halloween night 1971 has resulted in charges against a 33-year-old Waterdown man.

He was specifically charged with arson in connection with a barn fire on Snake Rd. in Burlington but

his arrest followed an investigation by Waterdown OPP into a series of barn and farm outbuilding fires Oct. 31, 1971. The man pleaded guilty before a provincial judge last week and was remanded in custody for a pre-sentence report. A sentence will be handed down this week.

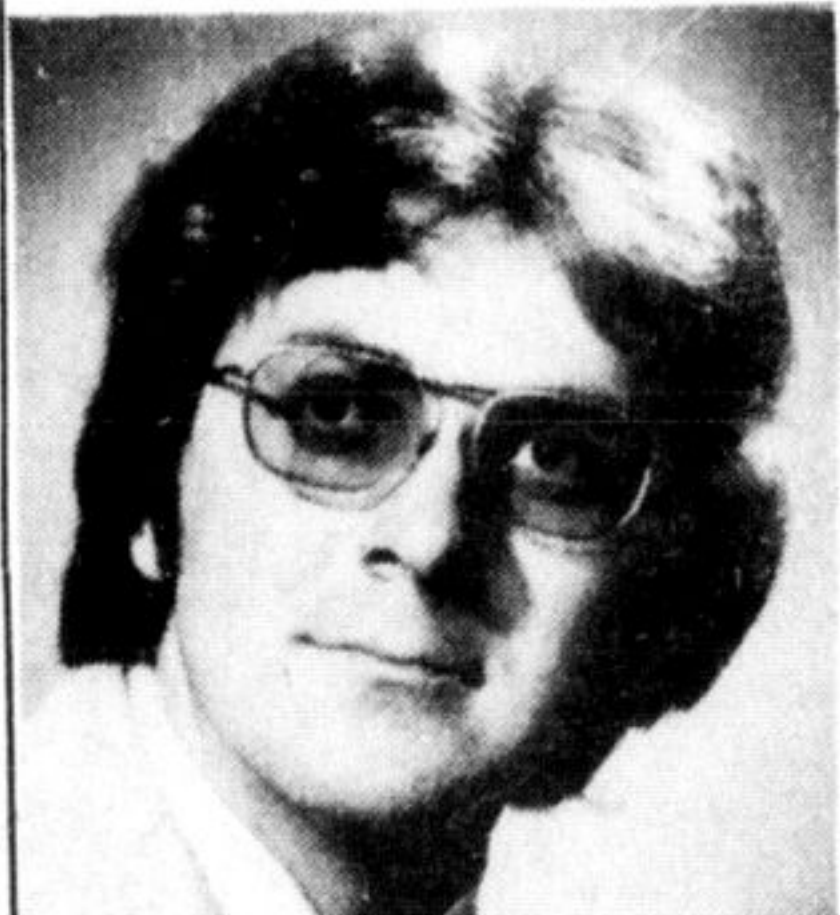

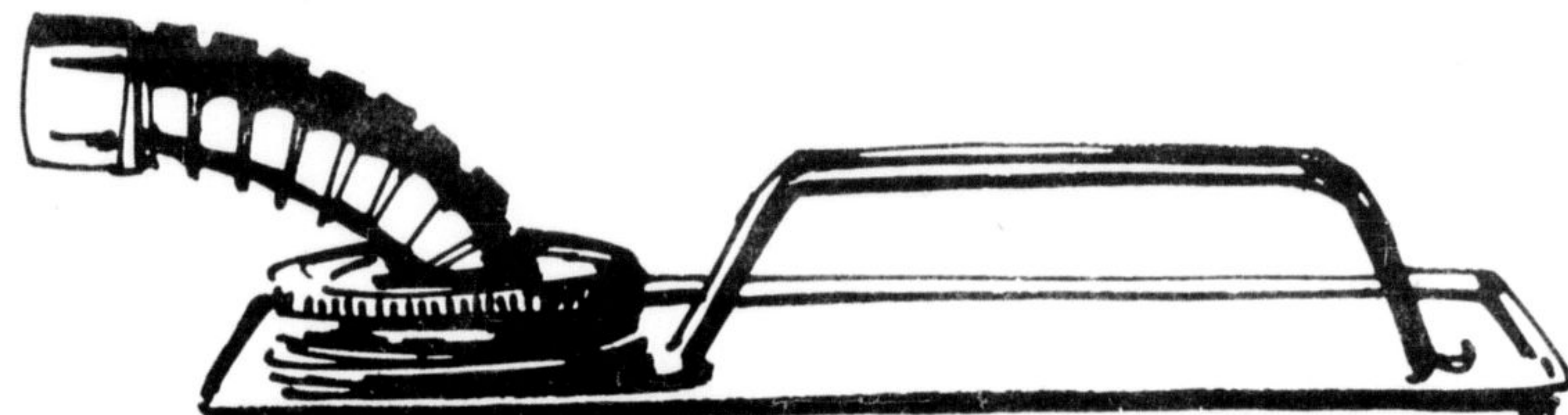
