




Coordinator June Gould reports about 85 bantams (aged under 12), 53 juniors (aged under 15) and 15 seniors (up to age 20) are currently involved in the Milton Youth Bowl ing Council's weekly activities and the program is so popular there is only room for a few more bowlers.

"We have a lot of new bowlers this year, I'd say about half of them are bowling for the first time," Mrs. Gould said. She and a crew of volunteer adult helpers teach the children how to bowl, how to score, the proper etiquette and good sportsmanship, she explained.

Among 60,000 Children attend from the Milton, Hornby, Campbellville areas. Youth Bowling has been going for 11 years in Canada and about eight years in Milton and Mrs. Gould hasn't seen any decline in the participants-in Canada today there are about 60,000 young people involved, plus over 6,000 adult helpers.
