#### Winter project loan granted for arena

municipal arena, the federal department of finance reported this week.

The project is expected to create 4,500 man-days of employment at a payroll cost of \$157,500. Under the terms of the winter projects fund, 100 percent of all labor costs in the winter months and 50 percent of the labor costs in the summer months are to be

A federal winter capital covered by the loan and projects fund loan of \$200,000 moneys spent on these labor costs are to be deducted from the \$200,000. An official of the finance department said the winter months are described as Dec. 1 to May 31.

Milton's second arena is scheduled to be under construction soon and completion date is set for May 31, 1974. The town will debenture the remaining \$295,000 of the cost and will have 20 years to repay the federal loan.


