

McNabb, Peddie, Stewart top 4-H members

THREE BIG WINNERS at the annual 4-H awards presentation at the Ontario School for the Deaf Saturday night were Ken McNabb, most outstanding 4-H club member in Halton County; Kim Peddie, most outstanding first year 4-H'er; and Paul Stewart, most outstanding member with fewer than 12 completed projects. Ken McNabb also accepted the Premier Club award for the Halton Field Crop Club on behalf of leaders Bob Merry and John Nurse who were absent from the presentation.

Ken McNabb won the J. E. Whitelock Trophy for the most outstanding 4-H Club member in Halton county at the annual awards presentation at Ontario School for the Deaf Saturday evening. A recipient of numerous 4-H honors, his major club this year was the All-Breeds Dairy Calf club. Ken was a member of 19 clubs.

Outstanding first year 4-H'er this year was Kim Peddie. She won the Claude Bain trophy and won with her junior calf at Milton fair. Most outstanding member with less than 12 projects completed was Paul Stewart. The recipient of the Halton-Peel Pork Producers award, he excelled in dairy showmanship. A consistent winner in the Halton 4-H Holstein Calf Club, Paul has been a 4-H member six years.

The Premier 4-H club of the year was the Halton 4-H field crop club led by Bob Merry and John Nurse. Secretary of the year was Holly Hurren.

The 4-H dairy and beef classes at Erin Fair in the 4-H Inter-Club Competition had almost double the number of entries of the previous year. Halton 4-H members were victorious in winning the championships in the 4-H beef and dairy classes. Kim Peddie of the Halton 4-H Holstein Calf Club had the Champion Senior Holstein and went on to win the Royal Bank of Canada Trophy for the Champion Dairy Calf.

Although Halton had only five beef calves competing, Dave Maher exhibited the winning Angus Steer; Keith McKinnon, the Champion Crossbred; Nancy McKinnon, the fourth placed Shorthorn Steer; Tim Copeland, the winning Angus Heifer and his brother, Tom, second placed Angus Heifer. Keith McKinnon's steer was awarded the W.C. Wood Co. Ltd. trophy as the top beef calf in the Monday 4-H show. The group of Keith McKinnon, Tim Copeland and Dave Maher from the Halton 4-H Beef Calf Club placed first.

Six exhibitors were entered in the 4-H Field Crop classes. Tom Parker, of the Acton 4-H Field Crop Club, placed 5th in the first prize group with his barley, while Joanne Wilson, of the Halton 4-H Field Crop Club, was sixth in the first prize group with her mixed grain.
