

Homemakers display books and projects

Ten of the 16 4-H Homemaking Clubs in Halton County met on Saturday at St. Paul's United Church, Milton, for an Achievement Day. It marked the completion of the fall project, "Accessories for the Bedroom". The day's program was carried out under the supervision of County Home Economist Mrs. Doreen Bannister. Members displayed the record books and bedroom accessories they had learned to make at club meetings conducted by their local leaders. Included in the display were sewn items such as bedspreads, cushions trimmed with corded piping, and linen dresser scarves, worked with Italian hemstitching. Other articles chosen by members were bulletin boards, wastebaskets, and lampshades.

Following registration at 9.30 a.m., the club members were asked to answer a quiz on color, plan bedroom furniture arrangement, and judge a class of four accessories.

The afternoon program was made up of demonstrations, skits, and exhibits, one prepared by each club. A large number of visitors were in attendance. Each of the 75 girls who completed the project received a sterling silver 4-H Homemaking Club spoon. County honors for completion of six 4-H Homemaking Club units went to Dorothy Eakins, Debbie Hood, and Kim Northwood of Palermo, Teresa McCarron, Alice van Ogtrop and Penny Kirton of Dublin, Monica and Rosemary Lukewski of Hornby South

and Lorna Sayers, Acton. Provincial Honors were awarded to nine members who have completed 12 projects. They were Judy Chase, Barbara and Deborah Preston of Hornby North, Irene Kidd and Benita Pries of Nassagaweya, Lynda Sayers of Acton and Dianne Westelaken of Palermo. Advanced Honors Miss Eleanor Smith of Hornby North was presented with an Advanced Honors Certificate and a silver pie server on her satisfactory completion of 18 projects and nine years of club work.

Canadian Council on 4-H Clubs Leadership Awards were received by Mrs. Douglas Inglis of Campbellville (five years) and Mrs. Cecil Patterson of Hornby South Club (15 years leadership). A special guest at the Achievement Day was the President of Halton District Women's Institute, Mrs. Mansell Nellis of Acton. The second Halton 4-H Homemaking Club Achievement Day will be held Saturday, Dec. 15 at Stewarttown Senior Public School.

NASSAGAWEYA Township Council BRIEFS

At a regular meeting of Nassagaweya Council Dec. 10 council:

—Agreed to sell a sink and counters to the Lions Club of Campbellville for use in the club's new building now under construction. The items were to be sold for \$1.

—Referred notice of an OMB hearing set for Jan. 22 to the new Milton Council. The by-law is to rezone part of lots three and four in concession four of Nassagaweya. The land is owned by R. R. Higgins and Associates Ltd.

—Learned the value of construction for the year will exceed \$4,000,000 in the township. Building inspector Terry Gallamore noted totals for the month of November amounted to \$184,500.

—Was advised by Reeve A. MacArthur that the township hall would remain open in 1974. She noted building inspector Terry Gallamore and roads superintendent Grant McMillan would continue to operate from offices there.

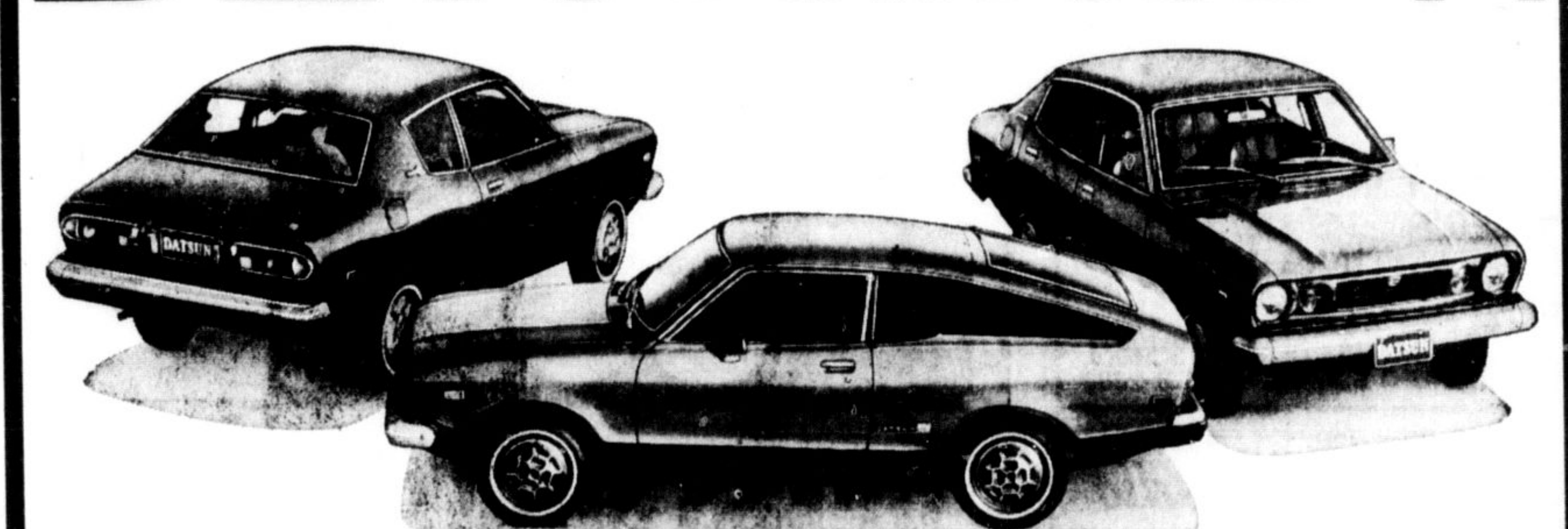
