### Drivers warned

Milton OPP issued a warning to motorists this week about the icy road conditions and also cautioned drivers who persist in driving with ice-covered and frost-

covered windows. Safety and information officer Const. Jim Redpath said "many of the collisions investigated this week resulted from drivers being unable to stop due to the slippery road conditions. A

snow-covered road is slippery

and the stopping distance is greatly increased."

Redpath said many cars have been seen with snow, ice or frost covering the windows and some have snow-covered rear lights. "It is almost impossible to see some of these rear lights when the drivers have not cleared the snow off them. Automatic turning signals and brake lights are all but useless when this happens," he pointed out.
