Optimists beat Burlington lose to Chinguacousy

Milton Minor Pee Wee Optimists won and lost this week as they coasted to 7-2 victory in Burlington Wednesday night but lost 3-1 to a strong Chinguacousy team in Milton Sunday afternoon.

Brian Serafini and Joey Gaeton scored two goals apiece in Burlington with Pat Roberts, Wayne McDougall and Ivo Zulian scoring one each.

From the opening face-off Burlington was intent on
