

# Last-minute brief "disastrous" line

A north-south hydro corridor would have a "disastrous effect" on Esquesing township, Redford Township, R.R. 5, Milton, wrote to Esquesing council. And at their last meeting Monday councillors agreed to hastily call another meeting so another presentation to the Soldant commission may be presented by the end of the year.

Councillor George Maltby agreed to meet this week with Mr. Gardhouse, Gordon Kidd, Federation of Agriculture representative who is involved with hydro presentations, and the township's two representatives Dolly Moulton and Sandra Symmes.

Mr. Gardhouse informed council he has a great concern over the real possibility of having a three, if not five, tower corridor coming north and south through the entire township.

Chinguacousy township,

Burlington, Oakville, Milton and Nassagaweya have presented strong briefs and representations at the Soldant commission hearings, he said. Indications are that they had a marked degree of success "and perhaps at Esquesing township's expense."

Not critical

"We have just as much at stake as any of them. I am not critical of the stand that (Esquesing) council took in recommending the 401 routing, for I am in full accordance with it. What I am going to suggest is that council propose a strong, straightforward north-south corridor would have a disastrous effect to the township and that you go on record as being adamantly opposed to it. Also that you again support your original recommendation of the 401 route, paralleling the highway to the Halton Sta-

tion. If you wish to do so, you might build up the reasons why it would be disastrous."

Mr. Gardhouse recommended Gordon Kidd and said he has a wealth of material to support a submission as he has already been involved in preparing the Federation of Agriculture brief.

Try anything

Councillors were concerned about the late date but Mr. Maltby declared "I'm willing to try anything."

Councillor Howitt was concerned how the brief could be prepared so quickly. He reviewed the fact Esquesing's brief recommending the 401 corridor route had been presented a year and a half ago.

Deputy-reeve Coxie felt the Soldant commission was aware of Esquesing's concern "even though we didn't weep and wail."

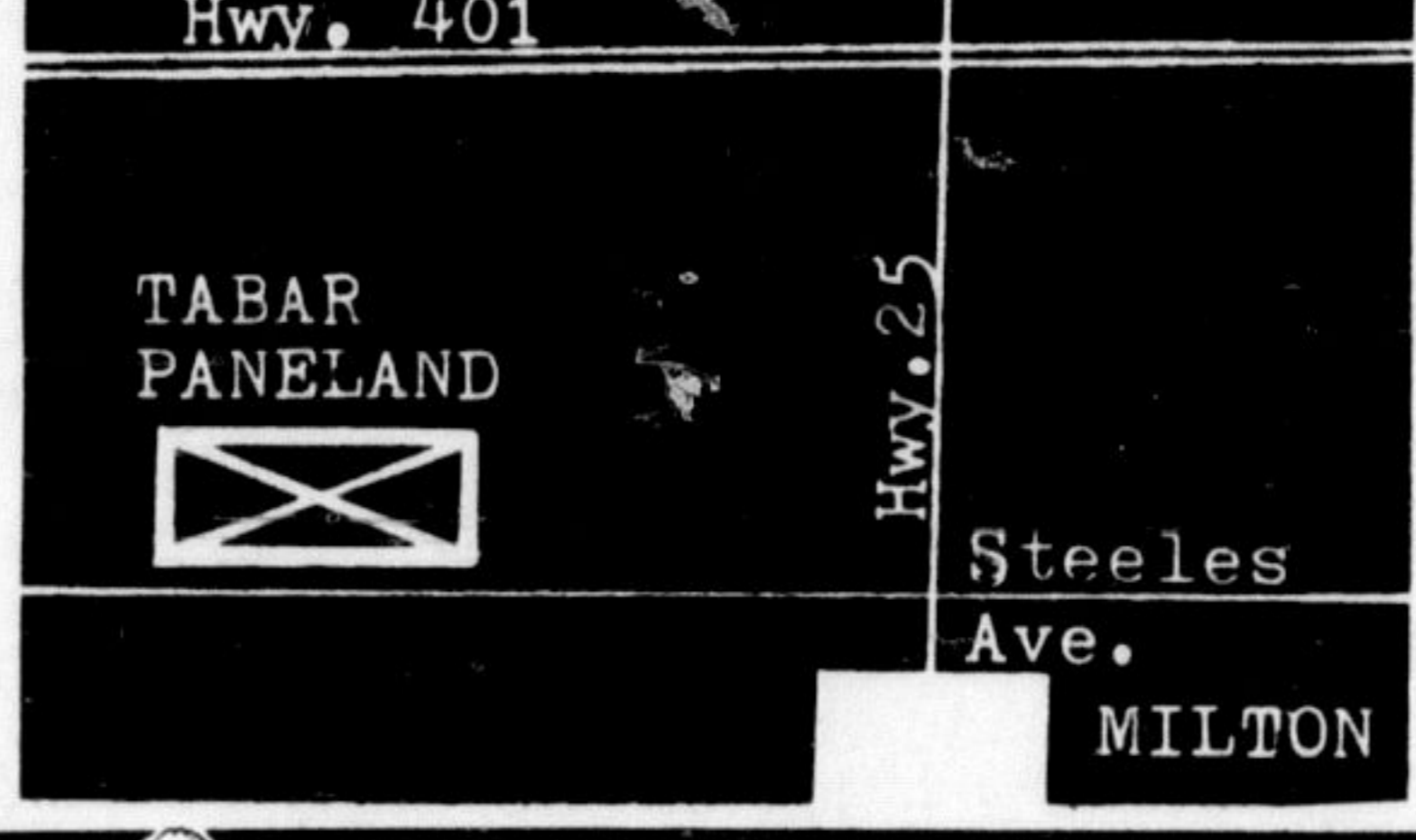
