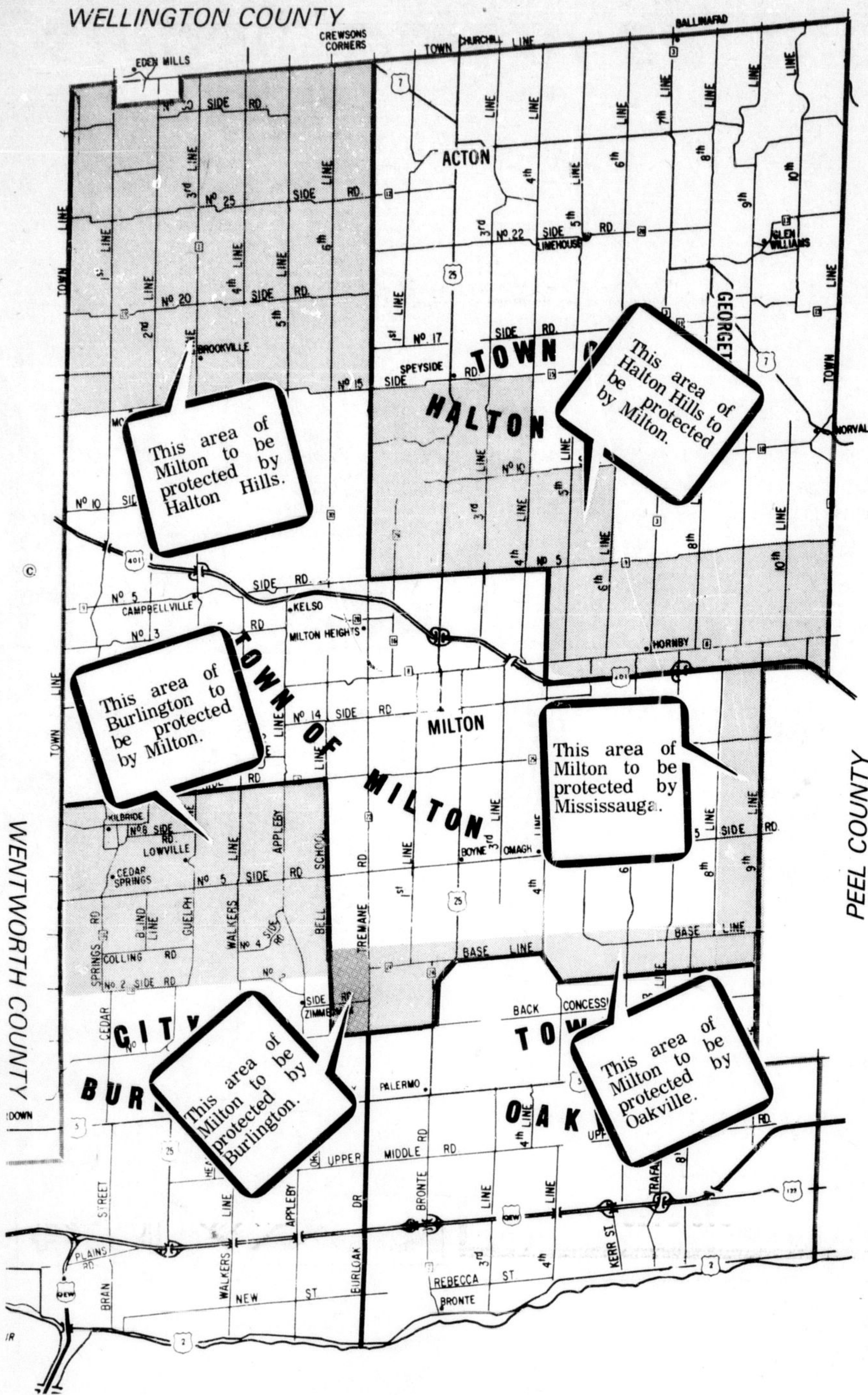


All will be protected

Little change in fire set-up

Needy get OSD gifts



The arrival of regional government and restructured municipal boundaries in Halton means a slight change in the fire protection set-up but Milton Fire Chief A. E. Clement this week assured residents in this area that no-one will go without fire protection.

Most properties in the rural area will continue to receive protection from the fire department which has served them in the past, although minor changes are contemplated. The safest way to summarize the new fire protection agreement is this: "Call your closest fire department."

For the past 15 years the Milton Area Fire Department has been serving the town of Milton and a 100 square mile rural area in Nassagaweya, Esquesing, Oakville and Burlington. The brigade has been administered by a fire area committee comprising representatives of all five municipalities. Costs were shared on an assessment basis.

Most in new town This committee and the area agreement comes to an end on Jan. 1, but the fire protection for the rural areas won't cease. Most of the rural lands previously covered by the Milton brigade join to form the new Milton borough in regional government, so protection will continue in the future as in the past.

Only changes are on the fringe areas where agreements have been reached between the fire chiefs of Halton Hills, Milton, Burlington, Oakville and Mississauga to carry out fire protection on a charge-back basis. These agreements will be ratified by the new councils early in the new year.

The protection areas are outlined in a map on page two of today's issue.

Lands in what is now northern Nassagaweya, north of 15 Sideroad, will be protected by the Acton division of Halton Hills Fire Department.

Carry on The area of Esquesing south of 15 Sideroad in the first four concessions, south of Five Sideroad in the fifth and sixth concessions, and south of Five Sideroad in the seventh to 11th concessions - now to be joined with Halton Hills - will still be protected by Milton Firefighters as it has in the past.

North Burlington lands in the area north of Lower Base Line from the Town Line to Bell School Line, although they remain in Burlington, will still receive protection from Milton.

Along the east boundary of the expanded Milton community, formerly part of Oakville, protection in future will be from the Streetsville division of Mississauga Fire Department. Lands east of the Ninth Line go to Peel County when the region becomes effective and an agreement has been reached for the Mississauga firefighters to extend their coverage as far as the Eighth Line in what will be Milton on Jan. 1.

Fire Chief Clement stressed that anyone in doubt about their fire protection should call him at 878-9251 and ask for an explanation. Maps detailing the coverage agreements are on display at the Milton Fire Hall.

"In the event of an emergency, it doesn't matter which fire department you call," he added. "We are in constant contact by radio with all the Halton fire

departments and it only takes a couple of seconds for one department to notify another."

In the case of a call going to the "wrong" fire department, he said the brigade which is alerted will respond but will notify the department which would normally protect that area. If the fire is serious both brigades will respond, he suggested.

The fire emergency phone number will remain the same as it was before, 878-6922.
