Proposes rezoning 800 acres industrial

Halton Regional Planning Committee was advised of a move underfoot to have 800 acres of land now in Esqueping Township zoned industrial. Hugh Thompson representing John Montague Planning Consultants told the

committee the area his client hoped to see rezoned was immediately north of Highway 401 and as far north as Five Sideroad. The land is bounded on the east by the CNR track and the west by the First Line.

Mr. Thompson said his client was Bill Johnson of Milton and noted he owned 200 acres of the 800 involved.

Councillor Jim Watson said the location appeared to be suitable for industry because of access to rail and a major highway and he noted the availability of water was an asset.

The proposal was referred to regional planner Ed Cumming and the Town of Milton. While the land is in Esqueping now, it will form part of the new Town of Milton on Jan. 1.
