Members of parliament Jim Snow and George Kerr are expected to be there and speak briefly. A former rector at Glen Williams and a friend of the mayor's, the Rev. Harold Llewellyn of Hamilton will read scripture and lead in prayer.
Business on the agenda is strictly formal for this inaugural. It includes passing the procedural by-law, the borrowing by-law and the by-law for the corporate seal.
The first working session of the duly authorized group is Monday evening, Jan. 7. At this meeting staff will be appointed.

Brigade's \$982 helps muscular dystrophy

Miltonians have once again shown their Christmas spirit and "dug deep" to aid those afflicted with muscular dystrophy.

Local firefighters, who sponsor the MD campaign for funds in the community, spent part of Christmas week counting the receipts from the plastic collection boxes they had left in local stores and offices earlier in the fall. The pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters collected this year totalled \$300 which, when added to the \$650 the firefighters collected in October at a toll gate at Milton Plaza, gives the brigade a total for 1973 of \$950

in the MD fund.

Earlier this year several local youngsters of Pine St. held a muscular dystrophy carnival and the financial results of that project - \$32.50 - were also turned over to the firefighters to forward to the Ontario MD fund.

\$131,000 in winter works grants on labor plus a \$20,000 community centres' grant to assist with construction costs.
The mayor said the town would still have to ask the OMB for about \$74,000 in extra financing, even if it went for a reduced project at \$480,000. Several councillors said they might lose all or part of the \$20,000 community centres' grant if the community meeting room proposed for the arena was not finished when the arena is built. They also feared further delays as the arena is needed for next fall. The contract calls for the arena to be substantially complete by June 30, 1974 and ready for occupancy by July 30.

Finally councillors agreed to "go for the bundle" and send the contract on for OMB approval, with their request for approval for the extra financing. Reeve Bob McCuaig was the lone objector.

Members responsible
McCuaig recalled council had earlier warned the library board and arena board that if their construction projects went over the budget, the members of the boards concerned would be held individually responsible. But arena chairman Rowney reminded him the arena board was unable to call tenders on its own, the tenders had been called in the council's name.

The reeve also objected to the design of the arena, especially when spectator seating is planned on only one side of the ice surface.

At their final meeting of 1973 Thursday, members of Milton Council:
