Where will our supply of beef come from tomorrow? Will it come from the full time farmers in Halton. Take a look around the region and tell me, just how many "beef farmers" do we have left. According to the 1972 statistics we had 2,900 beef steers over one year of age in the county. I know where approximately 1,200

Assuming the other 1,600 head are on small farms, each feeding 20 steers, this means we have only 80 beef farmers left in Halton.

Part-time or hobby farmers now represent the greatest resource for beef production in Halton. Many farms in Halton are now owned by our so-called 'hobby farmers.' If each one of our hobby farmers were to keep 10 beef
