

Big crowd shivers through

Hundreds of shivering Miltonians gathered on the snow-covered Rotary Park baseball diamond Friday night to kick off Winterfest 1974. Kinsman Rod Lewis acted as master of ceremonies from a flat-bed trailer, turned stage for the evening.

Lewis quipped with chilly members of the audience while Snow Queen and Snow King hopefuls and dignitaries were carried to the stage, two by two, in Bob Dennis' horse drawn cutter. Milton District High School students Nancy Nova, Mary Marcantonio and Bonnie Hill vied for the title of queen while Keith McKinnon, Bob Langridge and Tony Pedulla contested for king.

Joining Lewis and the students on the stage were political dignitaries Mayor

Anne MacArthur, MPP Jim Snow and MP Terry O'Connor.

Congratulations Mayor MacArthur stated she was pleased to see such a good turnout for so cold a night while Queen's Park rep Snow and Federal MP O'Connor offered their congratulations to the organizers of Winterfest. Milton Recreation Department and the Winterfest committee handled the snow party planning.

Politicians spoke quickly as the audience awaited the decision of king and queen. Bonnie Hill and Tony Pedulla were named second runners-up with Mary Marcantonio and Bob Langridge picked as first runners-up, leaving Nancy Nova and Keith McKinnon to assume the royal positions.

Gifts and flowers were presented to the contestants. Early start Announcements finished, the chilled gathering circled a snowy pile of Christmas trees while members of the Milton Fire Brigade sprinkled the yuletide pines with gasoline. Though Mayor MacArthur was to officially touch her flame to the evergreens, a match tossed by an unidentified viewer set the pile ablaze first.

But the wet trees refused to burn for either Mrs. MacArthur or the audience so Parliament Hill's fiery O'Connor struck the first lasting flame.

Smoke billowed into the night air as the smell of pine lingered over the crowd. Torches for the school children's parade were lit from the fire as represen-

tatives from Martin St., J. M. Denyes, W. I. Dick, Holy Rosary and Brookville schools lined up with banners to carry a chubby Milt the Snowman and the King and Queen in a parade to the mill pond for skating.

Chili and coffee Firefighters' wives dished up hot chili and coffee for chilled skaters. Mill pond ice had been cleared around the fringes to grant skaters a long circular path and George Swann with the Supersweet sound car provided waltzing music.

For the less athletic types, family movies were shown in the Rotary Park Community centre.
