the Raider goal to eliminate a stunned and surprised Georgetown squad.

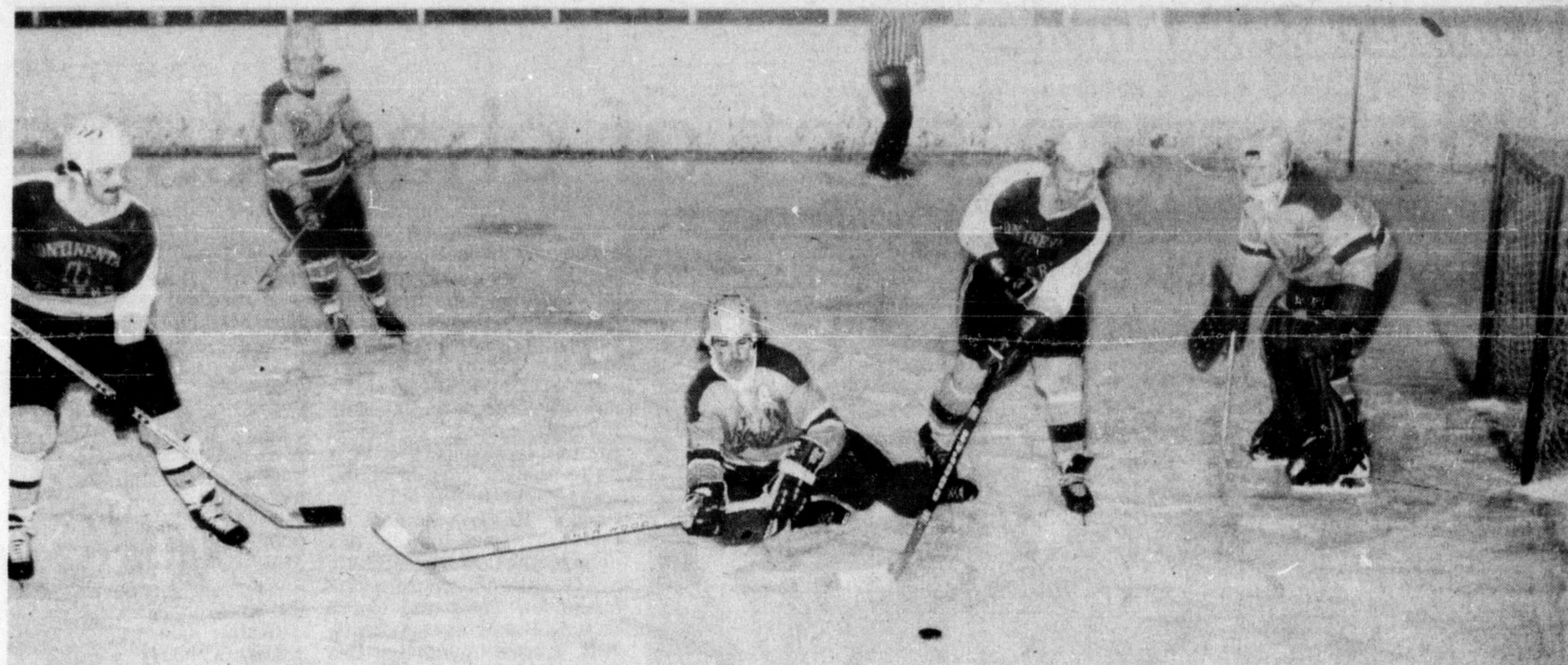
Zulian turned in a top notch effort between the posts.

Faced by the sharp net minding of Terry Cole, Tridents outshot Ayr 29-21. Hymers feels the Rockets will force his club into a hard skating series. "They are a very young team, they like to 'zip,'" says Hymers. "They are opportunists, plus."

Tridents will do all right "as long as we keep moving the puck up fast," concluded the coach.
