Councillors walk out protest closed session

Two councillors walked out of a Halton Regional Council meeting Wednesday, refusing to be part of an in-camera session unless it dealt with personnel and property acquisitions. Terry Mannell and Carl Eriksen, both representatives of Oakville, left the chambers when press and public were ejected.

The in-camera session was requested by Administration Committee Chairman Ric Morrow of Halton Hills, to discuss what he termed outstanding administration and finance matters.

Ejected reporters didn't miss the ensuing discussion, however. Councillors' voices were audible from the hall where the reporters waited.

Apparently during the clos-ed meeting Morrow expressed his frustrations as a committee chairman in trying to get resolutions through the council.

Motions rejected

Morrow's committee had recommended the hiring of staff for the legal department as well as for the purchasing department. Those recommendations were rejected at the council level two weeks

After the council reconvened as a council, the approval was given for hiring the need-

HRCA levy up 121/2%

The 1974 levy of \$503,483 for Halton Region Conservation Authority is up 121/2 per cent over last year.

However, it's not clear how the region will pay for its share of the levy totalling \$448,875. According to manager Murray Stephen it will be paid by either charging each of the four local municipalities on an equalized assessment plan or by some other method.

The remainder is paid for by the regions of Peel, Hamilton-Wentworth, and the town of Puslinch.

Milton's share, under the equalized assessment plan would be \$33,000; Halton Hills, \$30,000; Burlington, \$208,000; and Oakville,

Councillor Len Coxe of Halton Hills took exception to the amount his area would be expected to pay. Georgetown and Acton are not serviced by the authority. Last year the assessment for Halton Hills was \$10,000, this year an increase of \$20,000 brings the share to \$30,000.

Max Hatherly, secretarytreasurer of the authority, will ask the province how other regions are dividing up the levies.
