During a meeting of Milton Council Tuesday of last week in Brookville, council:

—Was advised of a public library trustees meeting for Halton at Holiday Inn, Oakville, April 27. The theme of the meeting will be a blueprint of library progress and the afternoon session will deal with the "Library 2000."

—Learned Mayor Anne MacArthur would lay the cornerstone for the new library Saturday, May 25 at 2 p.m.

—Agreed to send three councillors and possibly three staffers to the annual conference of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario.

—Agreed to consider the car allowance paid to A. E. Clement, Fire Chief as part of his salary.

—Granted permission for Halton Region Conservation Authority to hold a meeting in the town hall May 25.

—Agreed to purchase 1,000 pens at a cost of \$290 to use as give-a-ways at the Provincial Chamber of Commerce Conference to be held in Hamilton, May 25.

—Asked Director of Facilities Larry Arbic to get a cost on painting the side of the arena now visible from Main St. The arena wall was formerly sheltered from view by the Milton Inn.

Council will consider the recommended rates at its next meeting.

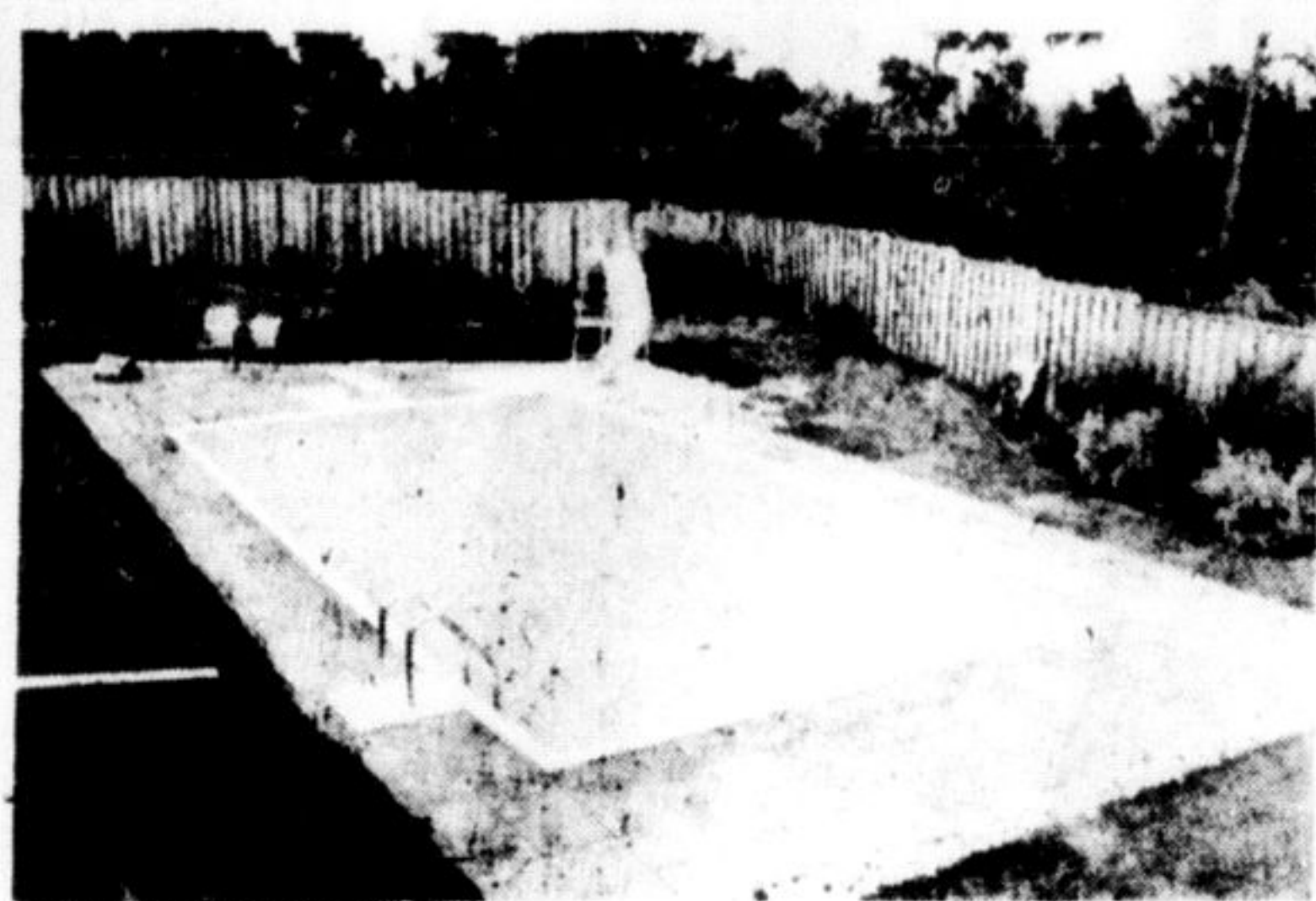
The township municipal building will be offered for rent at \$3 a square foot for the top floor and \$1 a square foot

for the lower floor. It was estimated the top floor had 2,900 square feet and the lower floor 2,700 square feet.

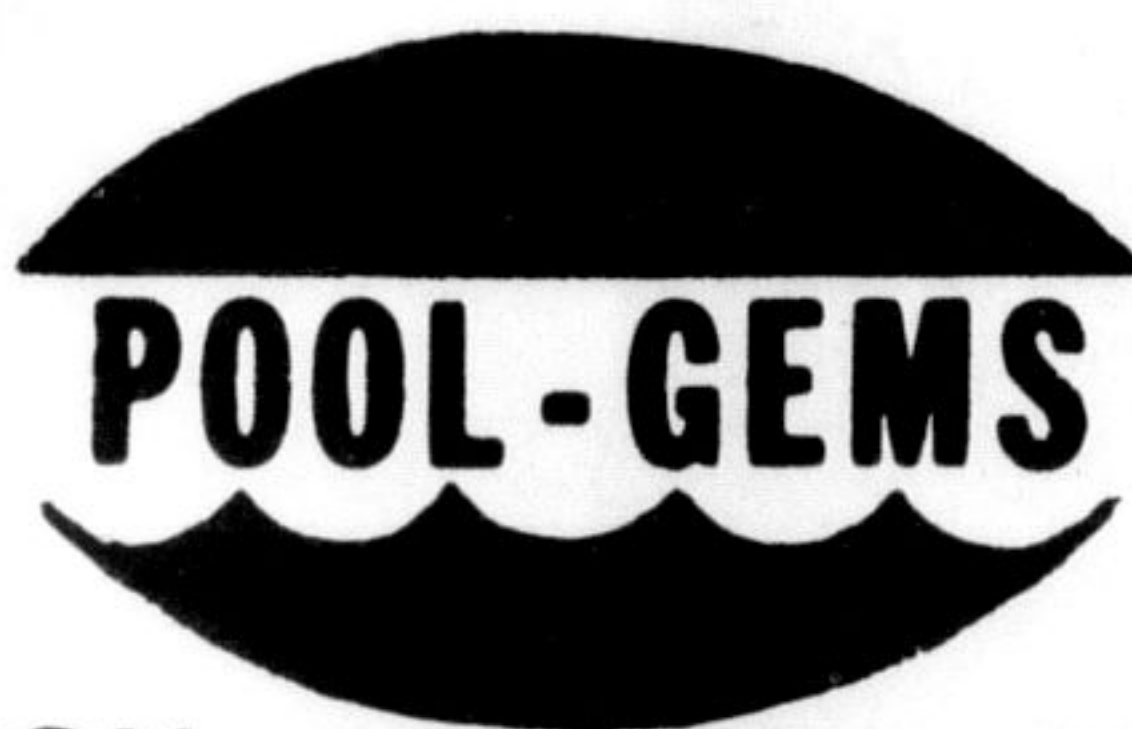
