Beginning artist's work goes to England

As soon as Karen Coleman began to walk, she started to sketch. Now she's 10, she swims, figure skates and plays baseball—and paints with oils.

Her mother recalls Karen would use finger and poster

paints when she was small, almost rather than play. Within the last year her teacher and Brownie leader recommended she take lessons to develop her natural artistic talents. Now her paintings are proudly hung in

the homes of friends and one is even going back to England with a visitor who saw it in one of those friends' homes.

Karen is the daughter of John and Helen Coleman of Appleby Line and began taking lessons from Mrs. Catharine Langton in Lowville last fall. Mrs. Langton is an artist of some note herself, and had been giving lessons to adults. She hadn't considered teaching children until Karen's mother asked her, and now she teaches a number of young hopefuls every Saturday morning throughout the winter. Karen and the others go to Mrs. Langton's, look at pictures from magazines, and greeting cards for ideas, and paint what they like, with Mrs. Langton's guidance.

So far most of Karen's subjects have been animals, still life, or landscapes, inspired by other pictures or photographs she has seen.

When she begins lessons again in the fall she would like to try some outdoor painting, with the easel her parents gave her for Christmas to encourage her. She would also like to try painting the family dog, and younger brother Greg, who is 8, has taken an interest in photography and took a picture for her to paint from. He's gone to a couple of painting lessons, too, but he'd rather build model airplanes.

It's still too early for Karen, who has just finished grade five to know whether or not she'd like to paint commercially or just as a hobby.

Her teacher thinks she has a talent she should develop further and calls her "Little Lightning" because she works so hard and so quickly. "She's a smart girl and I would like to give her all the praise and encouragement I can," Mrs. Langton said. "She loves art and she does work hard."

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Watts from waste

Toronto garbage collected in some routine pickups will be going back into homes and businesses in a new form — electrical energy — in late '76 or early '77.

During a two-year pilot study, Ontario Hydro will be burning 500 tons of processed garbage a day in one unit at Lakeview generating station in Mississauga. Separation of combustible material from re-usable glass and metal and other non-burning content will be handled at an \$11.5 million Metropolitan Toronto owned plant being built near Toronto International Airport. The pulverized result will be trucked 10 miles to Lakeview, where Hydro will keep detailed financial and operating records to determine the net value of processed waste as fuel. Modifications to Lakeview costing \$3.5 million are expected to be covered by the provincial government, which will also contribute \$1.5 million to the separation plant.

A Watts from Waste study team has predicted that the station could ultimately burn about 10 per cent of Toronto's garbage, which now amounts to 1.6 million tons a year.
