### Council briefs

During a meeting of Milton Council at the Boyne Community Hall, Monday night council:

—Agreed to assume roads in the Flamboro Center Properties subdivision at Campbellville Sept. 16, 1975.

—Agreed to accept and maintain roads in the Dorset Park subdivision.

—Received a request from Mr. and Mrs. W. Williams for sewage capacity to handle 16 lots. The request was referred to the clerk and planner for a report.

—Requested planner Bob Zsadanyi to provide maps and a report concerning a subdivision proposed by Windland Associates. The development has already been approved by Nassagaweya Council.

—Was invited to open house at Milton Fire Hall Thursday and Friday night as the fire department is celebrating fire prevention week.

—Was advised all pensions under OMERS had been increased by five per cent.

—Learned John Kitching had withdrawn his objection to a by-law that would amend the zoning by-law for the former township of Nassagaweya.

—Was advised it wouldn't be necessary to add Ken Jensen's name to a by-law used to clean up properties in the town. In areas where property has become unsightly (partially demolished buildings left standing, etc.) the town will clean up the property and charge the cost to the owner.

—Received a letter from Mrs. W. D. Marling requesting consideration be given to a lower speed limit on Five Sideroad.

—Accepted the report of the arbitration committee dealing with the disposition of assets, liabilities and reserve funds that were in that part of Esqueusing that is now Milton.

—Agreed to proclaim Oct. 6 to Oct. 12 as National Air Cadet Week in Canada and granted Milton Optimist Squadron permission to hold a tag day.
