-Was invited to open house at Milton Fire Hall Thursday and Friday night as the fire department is celebrating fire prevention week.

-Was advised all pensions under OMERS had been increased by five per cent

-Learned John Kitching had withdrawn his objection to a by-law that would amend the zoning by-law for the township Nassagaweya.

-Was advised it wouldn't be necessary to add Ken Jensen's name to a by-law used to clean up properties in the town. In areas where property has become unsightly (partially demolished buildings left standing, etc.) the town will clean up the property and charge the cost to the owner.

-Received a letter from W. D. Marling requesting consideration be given to a lower speed limit on Five Sideroad.


