ceptional, even as a youngster. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Haig McKenzie of Robert St., Milton.

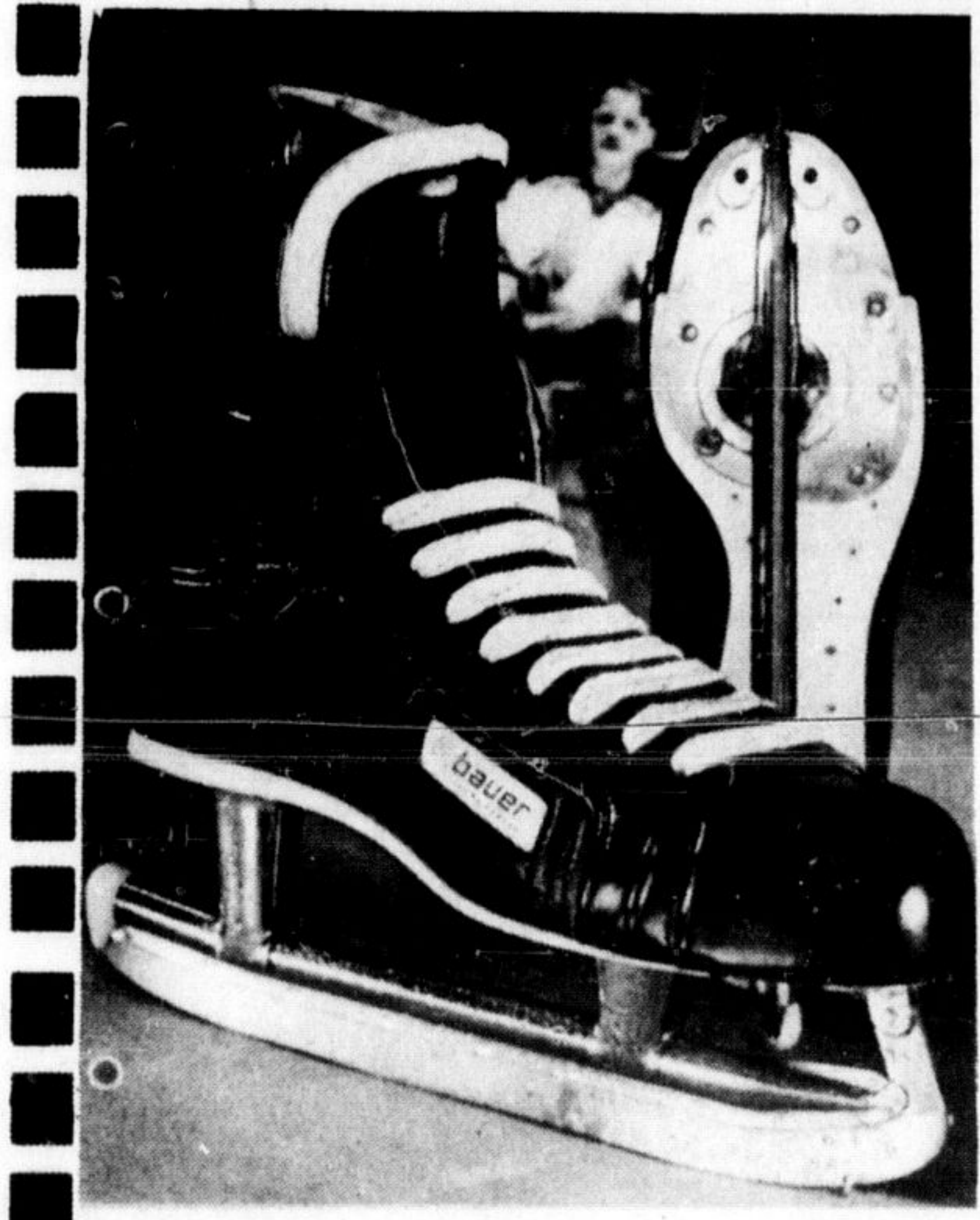

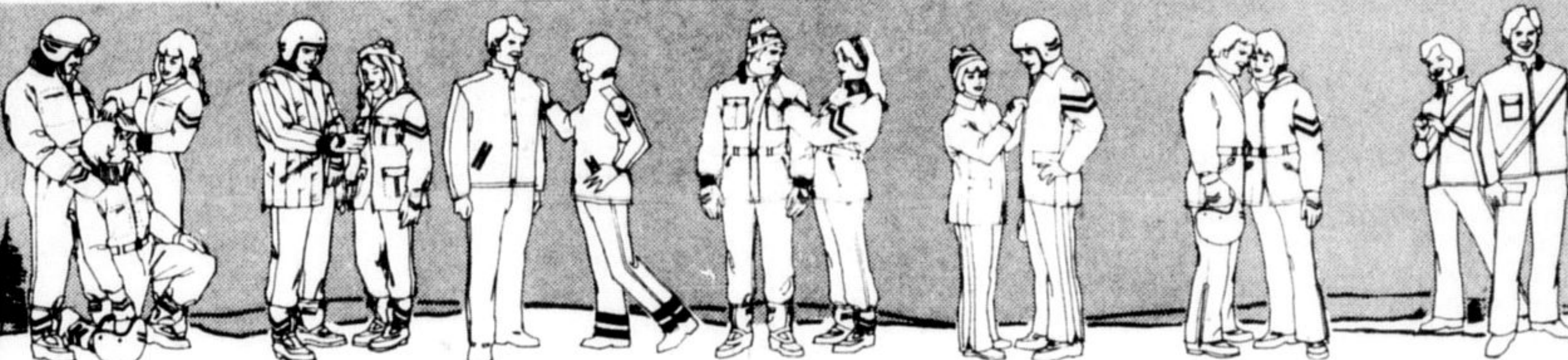
