



## Venereal disease

Venereal disease in Halton more than tripled in the five years from 1967 to 1972, but a reduction was noted in 1973. Final figures are not available for 1973 yet.

Therefore syphilis, although serious gonorrhoea if left untreated, is less prevalent in this part of the world. These figures, of course,

indicate an alarming spread of venereal diseases. Where is V.D. spreading? It is no respecter of social strata. That is, it is present in all socio-ecc ...ic groups. But it is more prevalent among the young-probably because the young are more sexually active. The age group 19 to 24 has the highest incidence.


