Women will discuss issues at Sheridan

Sheridan College begins the second session of Women Here, Women Now, at the Oakville Campus.

The program lecture series invites prominent women to the college to discuss current issues of interest to women in the community.

"The course covers as many aspects of life as possible in 20 weeks," said Sheridan program co-ordinator Pat Cook. The format will be similar to last year's course in which a different speaker will be featured each week followed by small group discussions.

Many of the speakers from last year will return to the college to talk on health, art, the labor force, films, media, marriage and the family, communications and sexuality.

Socialization
Linda Fischer, assistant professor at the University of

Waterloo, starts off the series with the topic "Mommy, what will you be when you grow up to be a Daddy?" Her emphasis will be in the socialization of male and female children. She claims children are socialized into stereotyped sex roles by the age of seven.

Helen LaFontaine from the Committee on the Status of Women will return to discuss the reactions and results of a survey she helped conduct concerning TV advertising. She was one of 60 women who spent several months monitoring Canadian TV programs with special attention directed to CBC.

On the topic of Women in the Labor Force, Kay Eastham, director Women Crown Employees Office, will outline the myths held by male employers which adversely affect female employees.

Women in Government will be discussed by Kay Mac-

Pherson, member of Women for Political Action. She claims Canada has the worst reputation in the world for participation of women in government. Ms. MacPherson has pointed out that since 1921 there have been a total of only 22 women members of parliament as against 2,000 to 3,000 men.

All these issues and more in the areas of Women in Films presented by Sheridan lecturer Joan Cox; Law and Women by Margaret Black, a successful Streetsville lawyer; Marriage and the Family with Marylee Stephenson, assistant professor at McMaster University, will be presented every Wednesday, from Sept. 25 to March 6 from 7.30 to 10.30 p.m.

Venereal disease

Venereal disease in Halton more than tripled in the five years from 1967 to 1972, but a reduction was noted in 1973. Final figures are not available for 1973 yet.

In a report to the Social and Family Services Committee of Regional Council, Medical Officer of Health Dr. J. H. Chamberlain outlined the situation in Halton.

In 1972 there were 400 cases and contacts in Halton, or one out of every 500 people. In 1973 one of about 350 were involved.

In 1972 the number of cases of gonorrhoea alone was almost three times the number of cases of measles in Ontario. One encouraging fact among the figures is that the increase in the incidence of syphilis is not so dramatic — 14.4 per 100,000 in 1967 compared to 20.6 in 1972. Therefore syphilis, although more serious than gonorrhoea if left untreated, is less prevalent in this part of the world.

These figures, of course, indicate an alarming spread of venereal diseases. Where is V.D. spreading? It is no respecter of social strata. That is, it is present in all socio-economic groups. But it is more prevalent among the young—probably because the young are more sexually active. The age group 19 to 24 has the highest incidence.

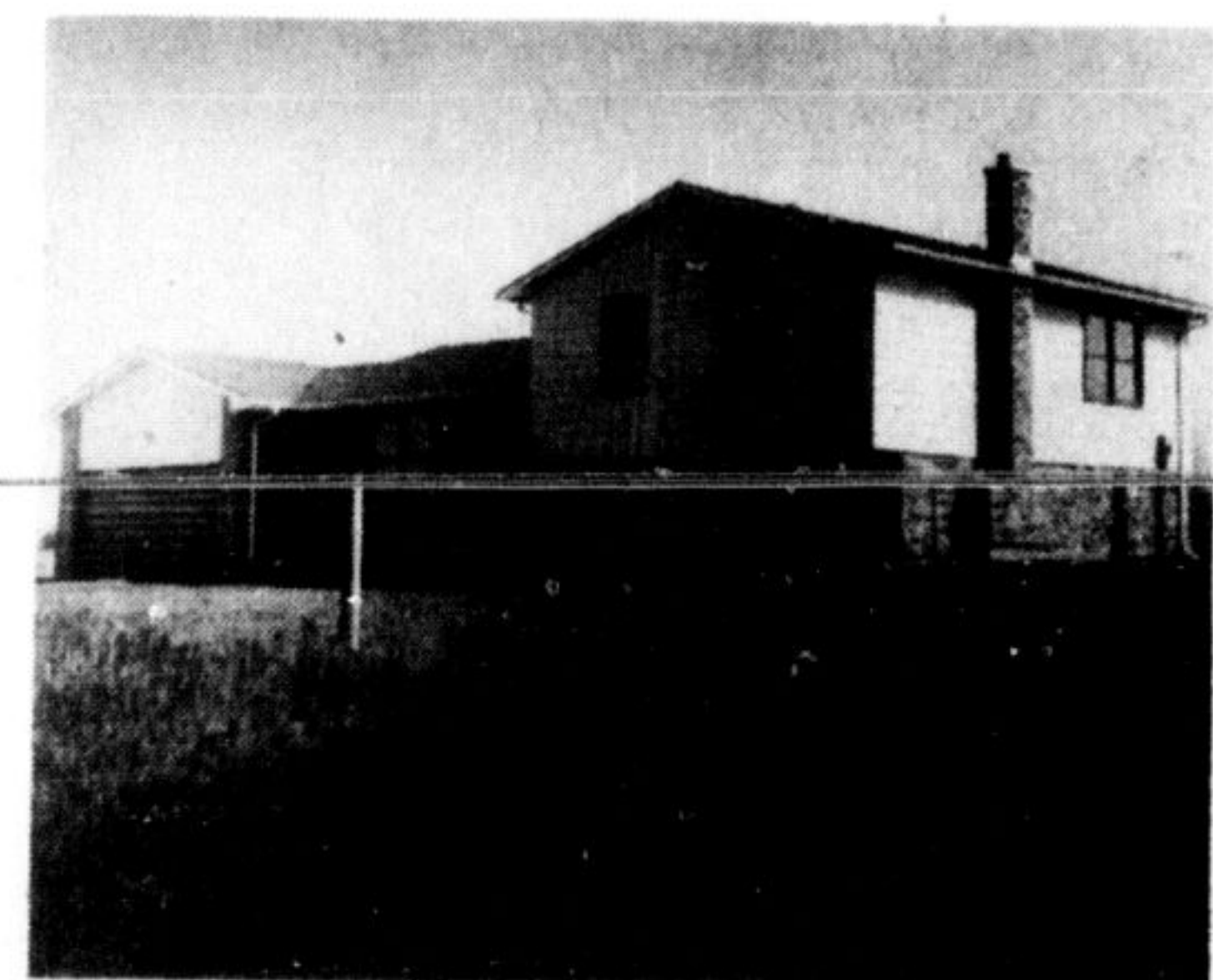
