

Also visiting were the Wrights' daughter Colleen her husband Eddie Boer and son Jamie from Bramalea who will be in New Brunswick on Dec. 25.



This small wood and iron wine press dates from about 1900. It was sold by the T. Eaton Co. in Toronto and

donated to the museum by Mrs. E. J. Costigan of Milton in 1970. Grapes are placed in a hoop which has no bottom and a plunger is screwed down on top of the grapes. Juice runs out the bottom and side of the hoop through a trough at the bottom of the frame.
