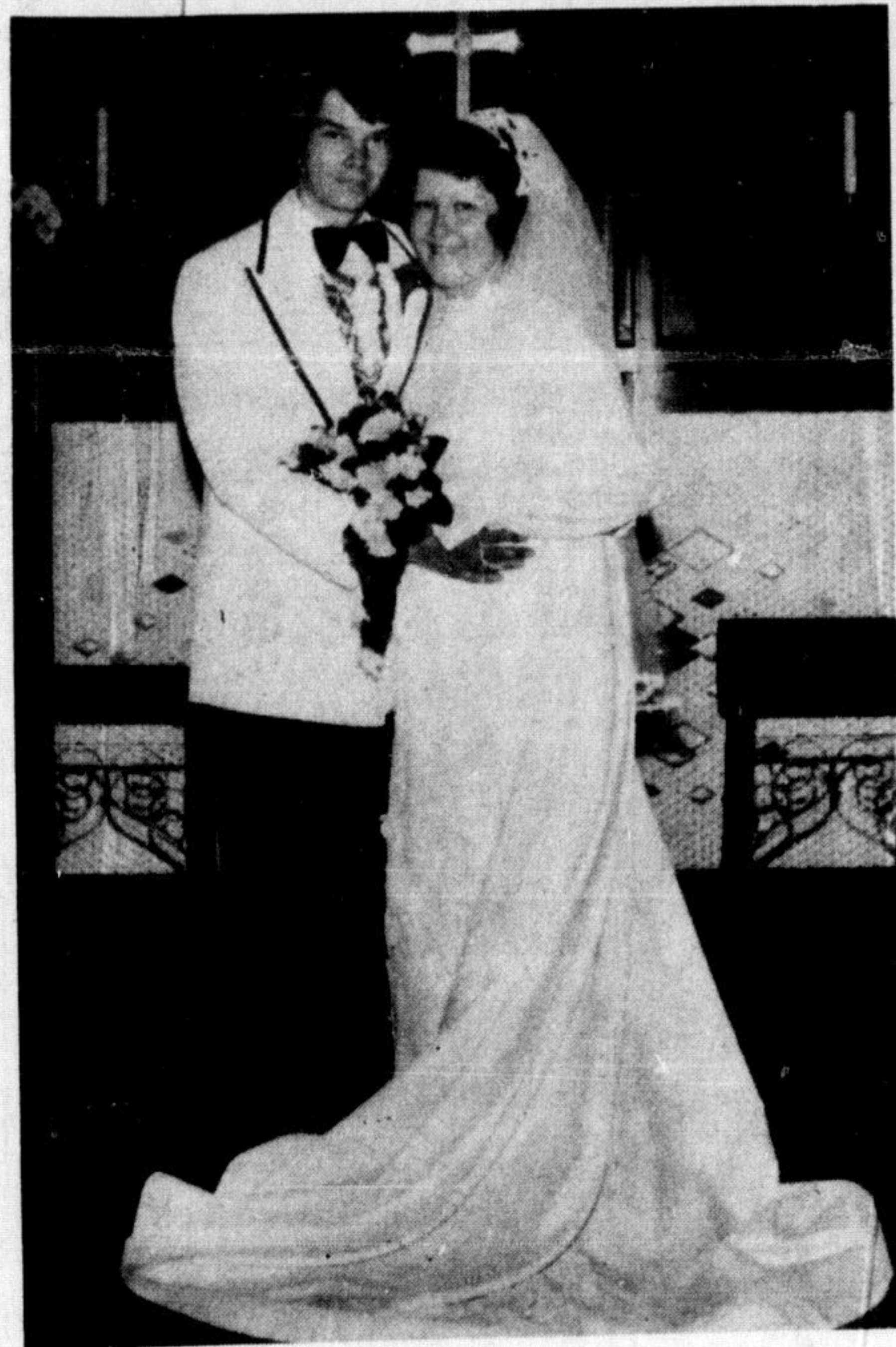


# Weddings
