JUICY SPARE RIBS glisten in the sunshine under the eyes of chef Al Steedsman of Toronto.



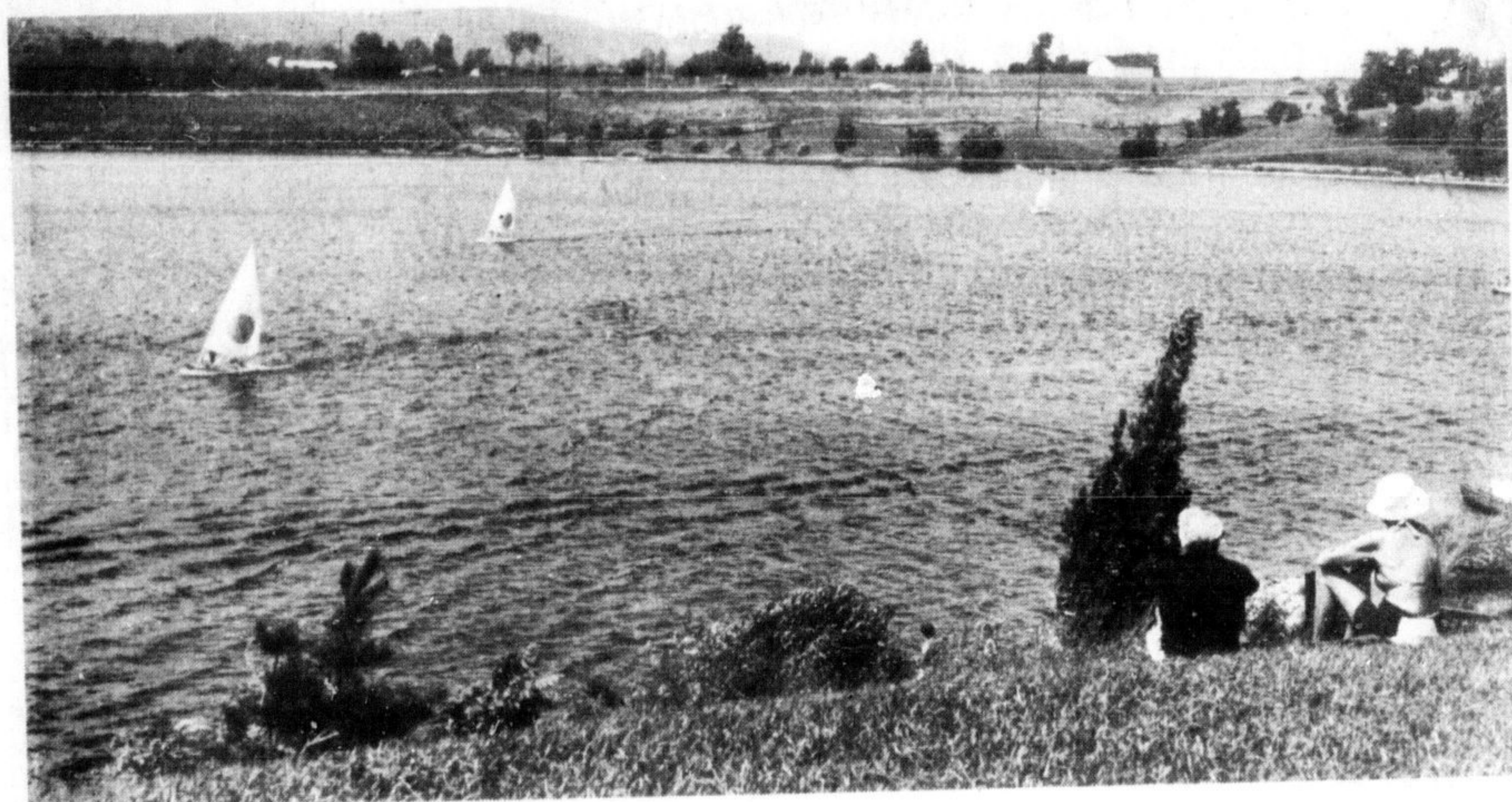
THE SANDY BEACH was alive with activity as the youngsters dug in to build sand castles.



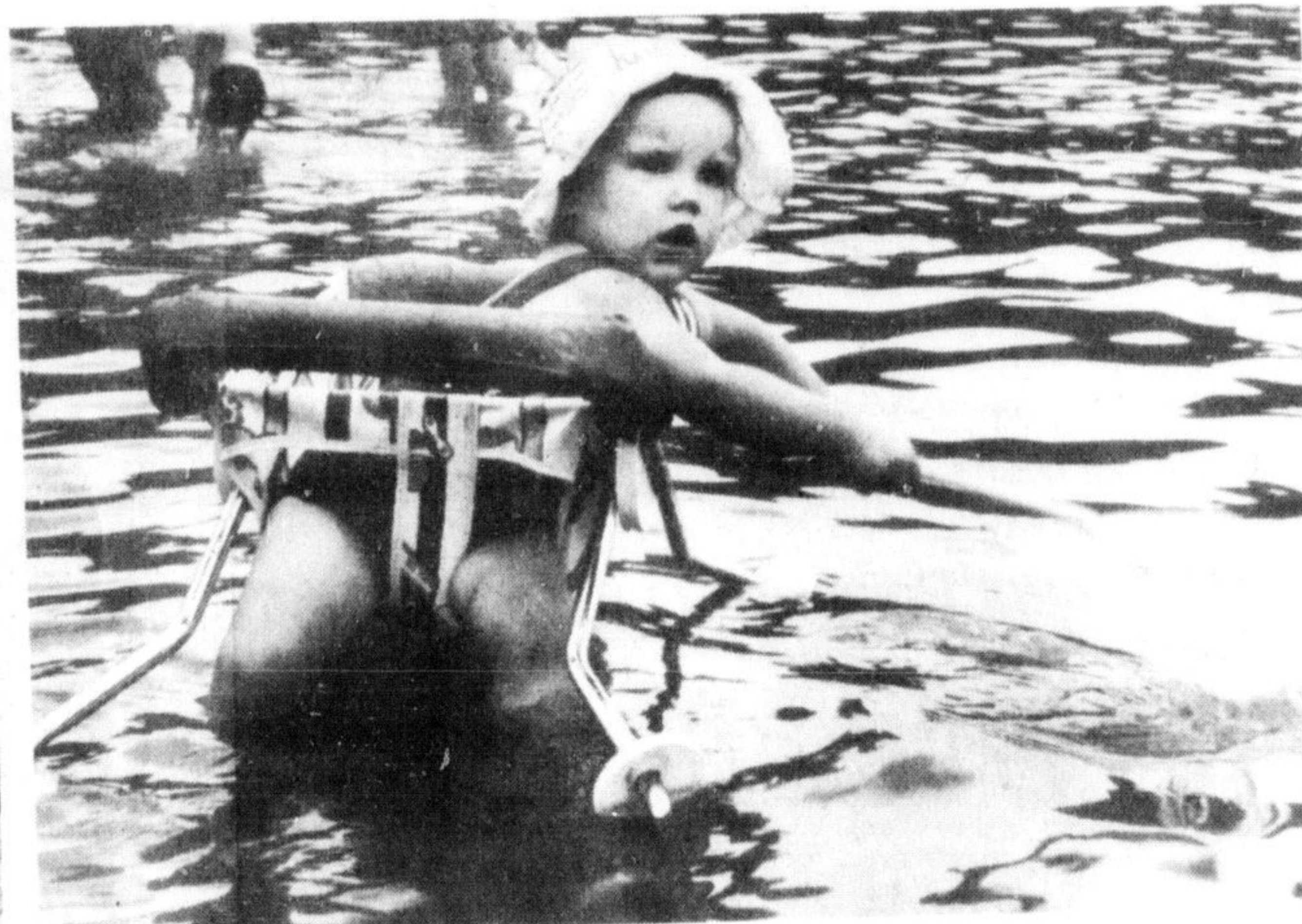
A SHOVEL, A RED BUCKET and plenty of sand kept three-year-old Robert Ozegovich of Burlington busy for hours.



A YOUNG BOY adjusts his line as other fishermen await a strike just below the Kelso dam.



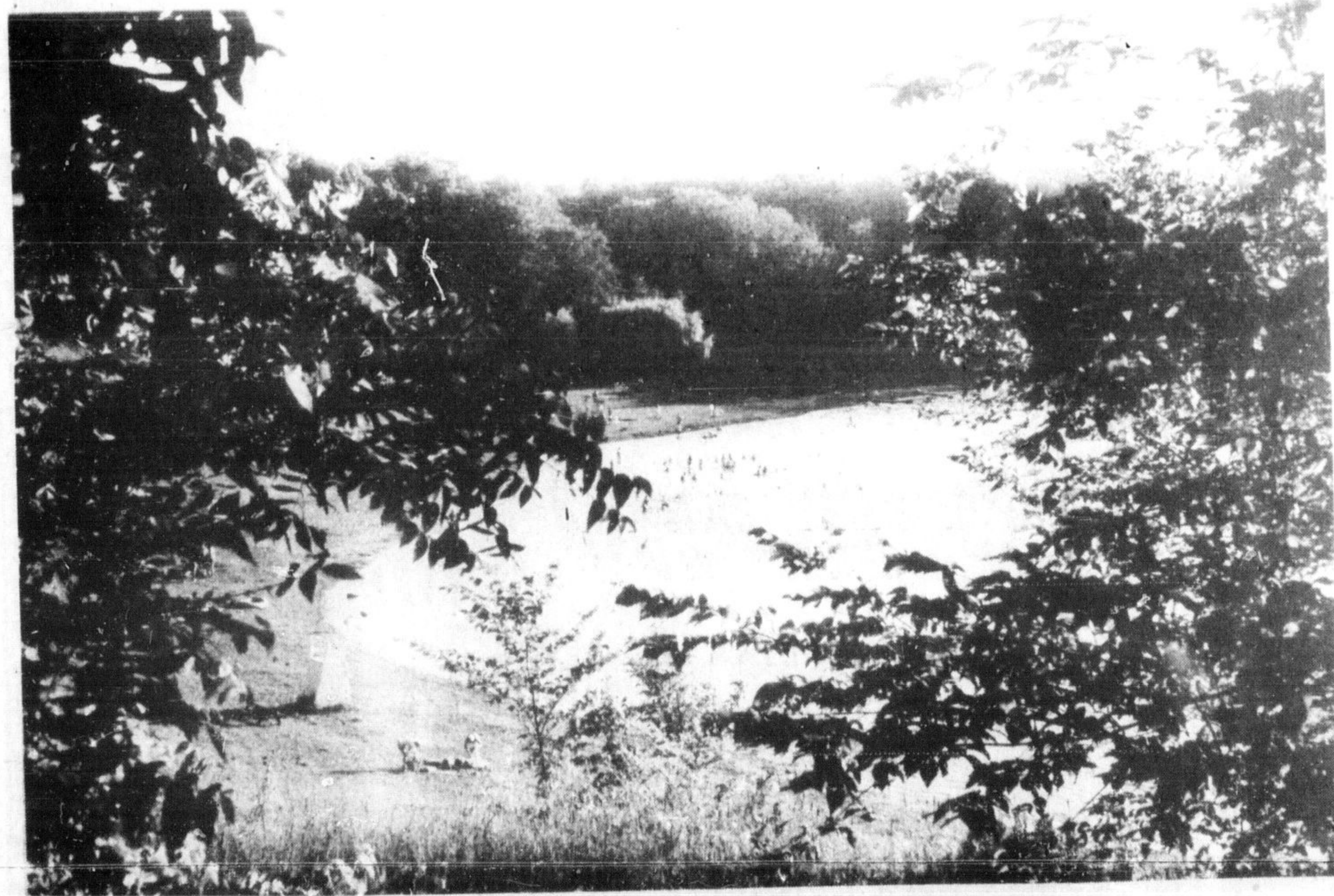
