

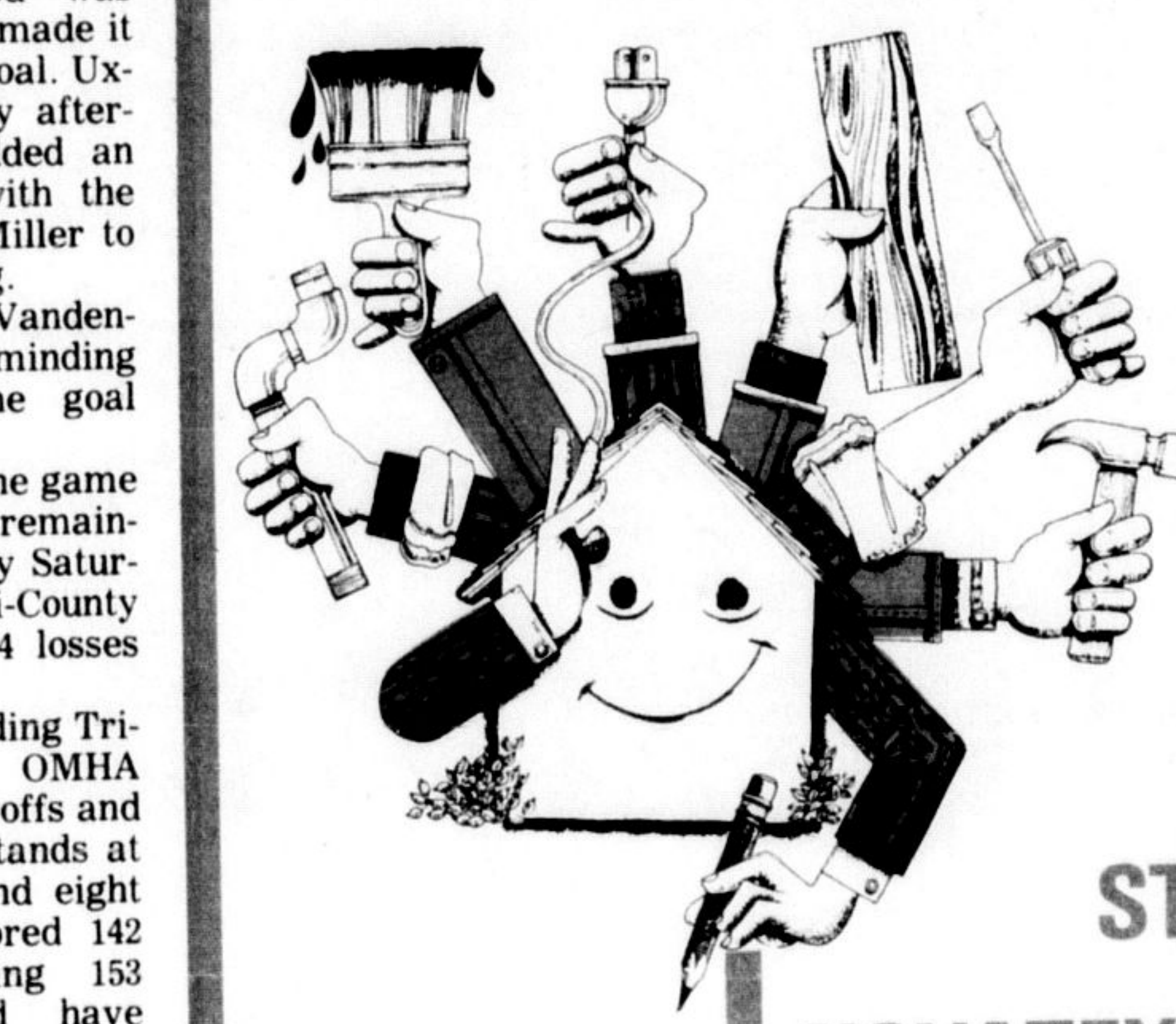

Milton major pee wee T-Birds improved their Tri-County record with a 3-1 victory over Chinguacousy and a 2-2 tie with Georgetown last week.
 Chinguacousy had jumped into a 1-0 lead on Sunday when Jeff Kortekaas deflected a shot past Milton net-minder Derrick Neelands but Barton Rowe tied the score when he slammed home a loose puck with the help of Tom Houston.
 Paul Benton got the go-ahead goal when he fired in a pass from Graham Griffiths, and Doug Riding rounded off the scoring when he beat Chinguacousy's goaltender with a low wrist shot from the point.
 The T-Birds ran into a series of penalties in the third period but Neelands blanked the Chinguacousy shooters stopping 13 shots for a game total of 19. His linemates fired 22 at Chinguacousy's net during the game.

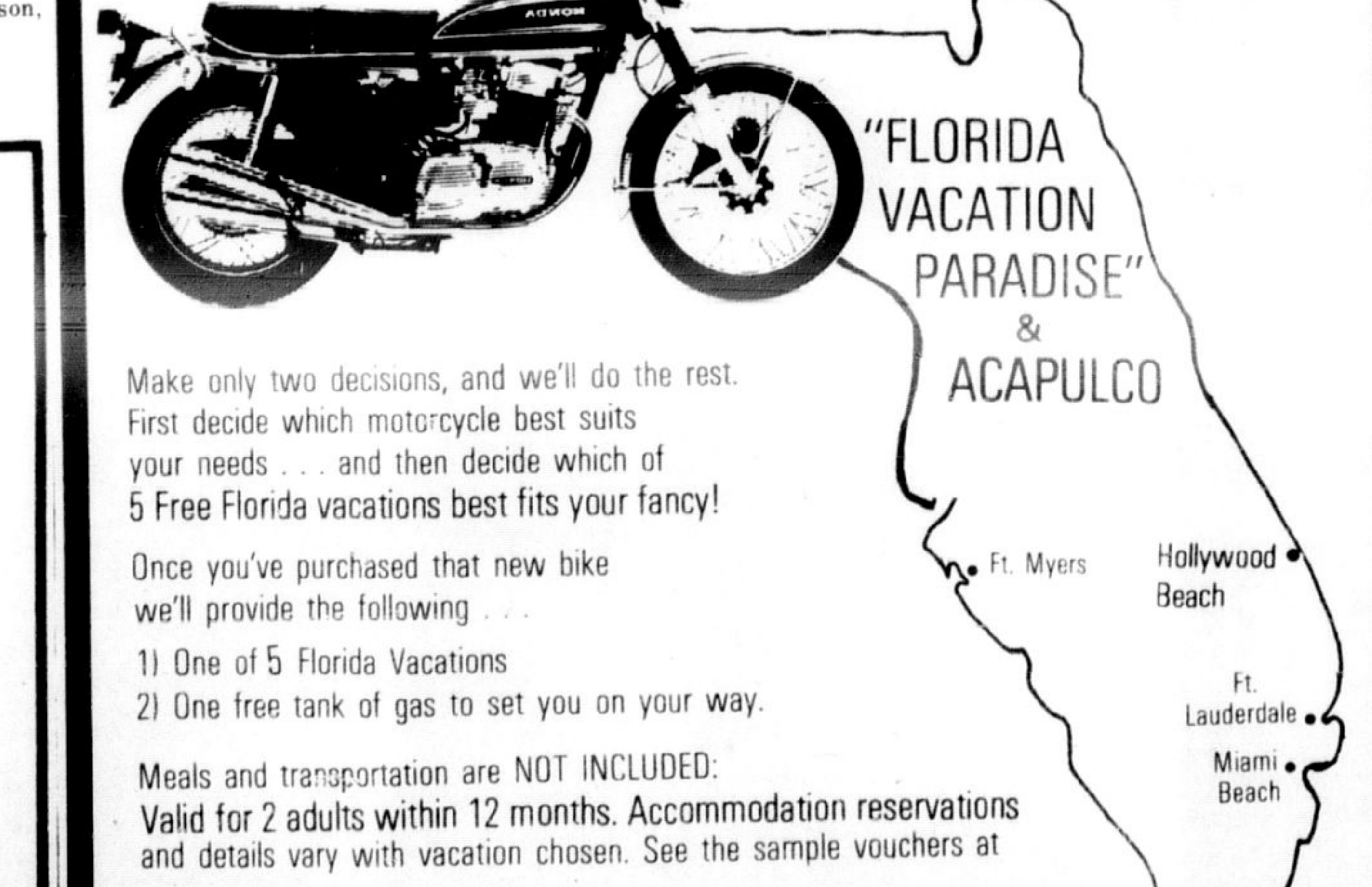

 Gooding from the game for fighting with Oakville's Marvel.
 The ejection of Gooding upset Inglis considerably.
 Gooding had not hit the smaller Marvel until after the Oakville player had slashed him and cross-checked him in the back of the head. While Gooding was ejected from the game, Marvel was given five minutes for high-sticking and two minutes for roughing.
 "A player can only take so many shots before he retaliates," said Inglis. "If the other guy starts it, the guy who retaliates shouldn't be kicked out. Marvel should have had at least 10 minutes for what he did."
 Inglis was also pleased with the continuing fine play of Ron Twiss and Vaitonis on defence.
 "Ron is playing exceptionally well, although it does hurt some to have one of your top scorers playing back," he said. "But the big thing is, he can skate back fast so when the other team shoots the puck in, he can get to it quickly. This way our forwards don't have to skate back so far and we can get the puck out quicker."
 The play of Jay Norland from the juveniles, and Brett

Patterson, from the major midgets has also helped stabilize the Flyers' defence, especially with Mike Leslie still out with an ankle injury.
 Patterson demonstrated he won't back down from anyone, even after it appeared Oakville's Kevin Moodie was after the youngster's head for his trophy room.
 "He took a couple of dillies out there, didn't he," said Inglis. "But he's a good youngster and came right back onto the ice after them."
