Love without God impossible says Day of Prayer speaker

"Real love comes from God. But it doesn't come naturally. It is an art which is acquired through effort and knowledge."

This is the way Anne Ho, guest speaker at the World Day of Prayer service at Knox Presbyterian Church Friday afternoon, described her perception of what is probably the most abused word in the English language today.

Speaking on the theme "Love In Action", Mrs. Ho said Christians often yearn for kindness and understanding, yet sadly fail to display these same qualities to their fellow man.

"We need a real demonstration of love in our Christian homes and churches today," Mrs. Ho told the mainly female gathering of 85 inside Knox Church. "If there was more love, there would be less controversy and strife in our lives."

Mrs. Ho said most of us know little of actually loving people — especially those who don't agree with us or whose personality rubs us the wrong way.

And sometimes, she noted, the person we find it difficult to get along with is not even an outsider.

"It may be a person who is close to us — maybe even a member of our own family," she said.

In cases like this, Mrs. Ho

said, love doesn't just happen. It comes about gradually through effort and prayer.

Mrs. Ho said the definition of love found in the dictionary is only superficial and that the only complete definition of the word must include God because, she said, "God is love."

"Love on the human level is often transient and conditional," she said. "But God's love is self-giving, impartial and everlasting. Unlike our love for Him, God's love never changes."

"Isn't it nice that we don't have to worry about God's mood-swing?" the former university nursing lecturer smiled.

Mrs. Ho went on to explain that when Christ walked the earth, he met the spiritual needs of the people as well as their physical needs.

For example, she said, he gave sight to the blind man and also healed his "spiritual blindness" in the process.

"Likewise," Mrs. Ho said, "we should love people's souls as well as their bodies." Outlining the difference between "quality" and "quantity" love, Mrs. Ho read a passage from St. Paul in the New Testament which described love as being "patient, kind, enduring and long-suffering."

The example of perfect love, she said, was when Jesus hung dying on the cross and said of his murderers:

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

"How many of us really understand this kind of love?" Mrs. Ho asked.

The mother of three young children, Mrs. Ho added that God's love includes disciplining.

"Chastening quietly produces the fruit of all goodness for those who accept it in the right spirit," she said. "But it is sometimes easier for parents to overlook a fault in their child than to correct it."

"However," she said, "love must sometimes correct."

Finally, Mrs. Ho told the afternoon gathering "To know God is to love Him."

"God is the greatest lover," she said, "and the fruit of His spirit is love."

"We all need to develop a hunger and thirst for the nature of Christ to be reproduced in us, and the way to do this is through study, prayer, sacrifice and obedience," she said.

Getting to know God, she said, is the challenge of learning to put our love into action.

Later in the afternoon, about 60 children from congregations in the community attended a second

service at Knox Church with guitar and piano music under the direction of Mrs. M. Willoughby.

At a third evening service at Knox, the Rev. John Roberts spoke to a gathering of 40 people on the "Love In Action" theme.

The fourth service was held at Halton Centennial Manor. Verna Cailan was guest speaker and Mrs. S. Lackin and Mrs. Thompson provided the music for the full chapel.

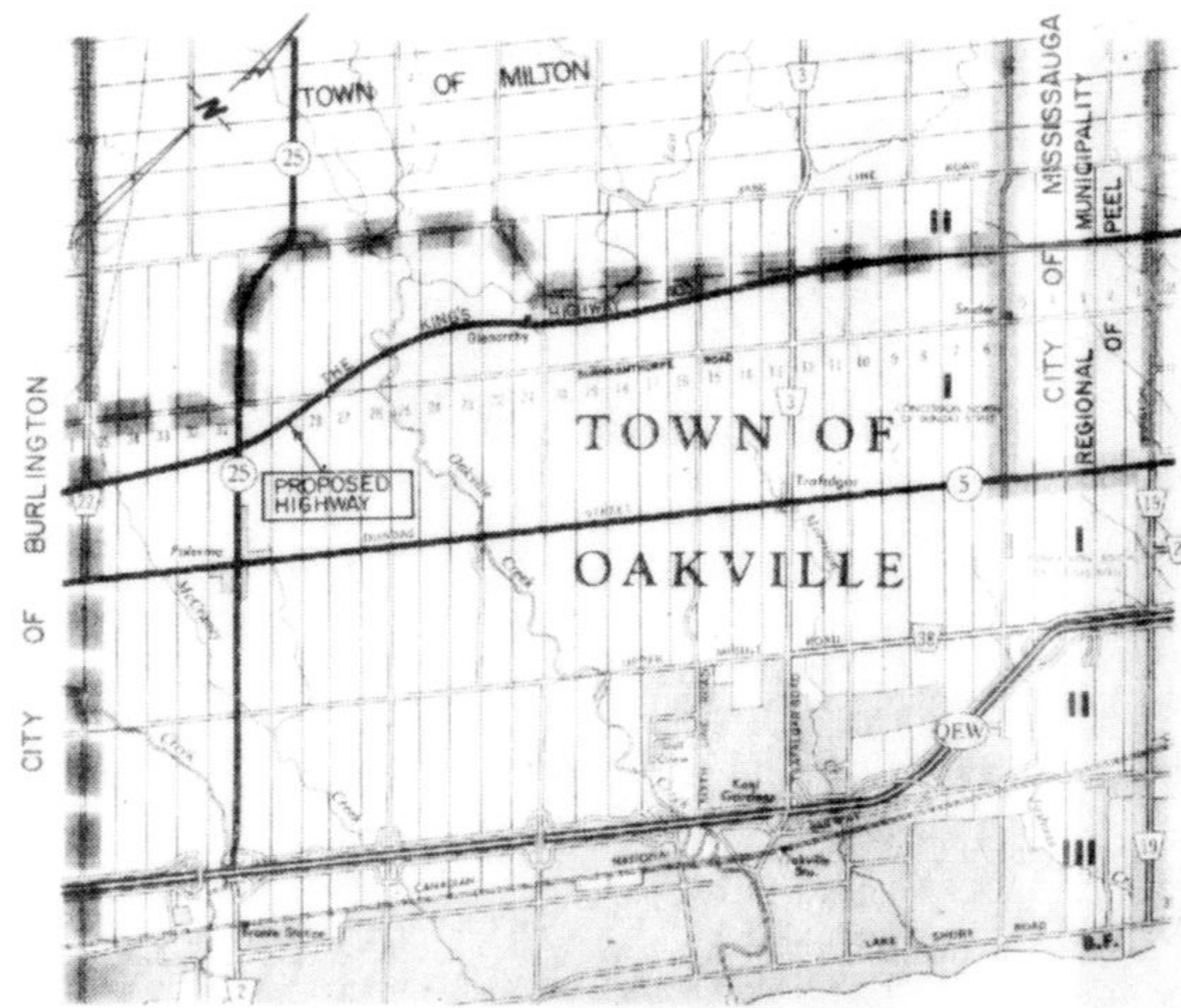

THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT ACT PUBLIC NOTICE

IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to section 33 of The Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act (R.S.O. 1970, c.201 and amendments thereto) the Lieutenant Governor in Council did designate the proposed highway known as Highway 403, as a Controlled-Access Highway. The effective date of the designation as a Controlled-Access highway was the 4th day of June, 1976.

The proposed highway having a right-of-way in width of approximately 400 feet to 500 feet is located in:

1. The City of Mississauga (geographic township of Trafalgar), Regional Municipality of Peel, Lots 5, 7 and 8, Registrar's Compiled Plan 1542
2. The Town of Oakville (geographic township of Trafalgar), Regional Municipality of Halton, Lots 2 to 28 inclusive, Concession 2, North of Dundas St. and Lots 27 to 35 inclusive, Concession 1, North of Dundas St.
3. Town of Milton (geographic township of Trafalgar), Regional Municipality of Halton, Lots 6 to 12 inclusive, Concession 2, North of Dundas St. as shown hereunder:-



Ministry of Transportation and Communications Plan P-5015-17 illustrating the King's Highway and controlled-access highway designations, was filed with the Manager of Record Services of the Ministry of Transportation and Communications at Downsview on April 5, 1976. Ontario Regulation 495/76 designating the proposed highway as a controlled-access highway was published in the Ontario Gazette dated June 19, 1976.
