March Madness. There couldn't have been a more fitting name for the school break program offered by the Milton YM-YWCA and Milton Parks and Recreation Department to vacationing students last week.

Recreation programs at Robert Baldwin and J.M. Denyes Schools were filled to capacity every day, and Parks and Rec Program director Karen Uhrin said some children had to be turned away each day because there just wasn't enough room.

"We had a 100 per cent increase in attendance over last year," Ms. Uhrin told The Champion Monday. "The community is growing so fast, it's hard to keep up. It looks as though we may be needing more facilities by the time our March break program rolls around again next year."

Ms. Uhrin said a total of 160 children took part in the

March 21 March Madness activities while 250 showed up for Carnival Capers on the 22nd.

Close to 500 youngsters gathered at the two schools March 23 for "Happy Days" and 80 crowded the auditorium at J.M. Denyes last Thursday for "Here Comes the Ether Bunny."

In addition to these programs, an average of 150 people took advantage of afternoon swimming at E.C. Drury pool on the days it was offered and an average of 60 swam each night.

The ice at Milton Memorial Arena was also filled during public skating hours.

On the other hand, only two dozen youngsters took part in the out-of-town activities at Bronte Creek Provincial Park and "African Lion Safari" the days these trips were offered.

Ms. Uhrin said there was room for twice as many children on these excursions.
