HEART: CANADA'S BEST NEW ROCK BAND"

At this year's Juno Awards (the equivalent to the Grammy in U.S., Heart was voted Best Canadian Rock Group. The competition included Bachman Turner OverDrive, April Wine, The Stampeders and Rush.

In less than two years, Heart has risen from being just another good bar-band to the top of Canada's rock scene. Their rise began in 1972, when Nancy and Ann Wilson formed a folk group, called the Mode. They had little luck. Later that year, Nancy met Roger Fisher. He was the guitarist for White Heart. They fell in love and decided to form another band. Nancy's sister Ann, along with three male musicians Steve Fossen, Howard Leese and Mike Derosiers, were added.

Heart is a group that has all American citizens. They are considered a "Canadian" group because Vancouver is their base and Heart was conceived on Canadian soil. They toiled for many months, playing the bars in and around Vancouver. During one of their shows, the head of a small Canadian recording company was in attendance. He signed Heart on his Mushroom label. With his determination and money, Heart recorded "Dreamboat Annie." To say the album was successful isn't enough. . . Heart became a phenomenon!

During 1975, Heart toured throughout North America. Three singles were released: "Magic Man," "Crazy on You" and "Dreamboat Annie." All three made the top 10. They enjoyed both commercial and critical favorable response in 1976. Heart has already recorded their second album, "Magazine". If this album is similar to the first one, Heart might as well become permanent citizens in Canada!

BEAU DOMMAGE: QUEBEC'S TOP ROCK GROUP

Translated to English, Beau Dommage means "sure as hell". Five French Canadians formed a rock group in 1973. They paid their dues by playing the small clubs and bars near Montreal. Becoming the best in Quebec was only a matter of time. Their style is reminiscent of Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young.

The band consists of Michel Rivard (spc'esman and guitar), Michel Hinton (guitar), Real Desros (guitar), Marie Michele Desrosiers (vocals) and Pierre Bertrand (drums).

Beau Dommage has recorded three albums on Capital Records: "Beau Dommage," "Wedding Night" and "Another Day Comes to the City".


