

Collect 35 tons of trash

Town work crews collected about 35 tons of scrap, brush and rejected furniture during a town-sponsored clean-up Saturday morning.

The clean-up was restricted to the north side of Main St. The south end of town will have its turn this Saturday.

Assistant Works Superintendent Will Penso said 12 men manned two garbage packers and three five ton

trucks from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. He said the crew covered the routes about three times before calling it quits. He said three passes were made to avoid missing someone who was a little late getting their garbage ready.

Mr. Penso said the annual pickup is a popular service for residents. "This stuff piles up and people really don't have any way of getting rid of it."

Arena fund-raisers back in action soon

Once the final price is determined for Milton's proposed new arena on a parksite adjacent to Milton District High School, the arena fund-raising committee will be back in action and actively campaigning for funds, Mayor Don Gordon told Milton Council Wednesday.

At Wednesday's meeting, council approved the siting of the arena building on the park property just north of Laurier Ave. and approved preliminary work on the site to prepare it for an arena.

Blanche Hinton, a ratepayer who has been following the arena controversy closely for the past year, asked what council plans to do about raising money for the new arena. "I am concerned," she said.

The mayor assured her once the tenders are in and the final price is known, the former committee will be back in

action. The Wintario grant is still available, he noted.

Mrs. Hinton wondered how much the committee will have to raise locally. "Will it be \$100,000 plus?" she asked.

"\$180,000 to \$190,000," guessed Councillor Russ Powadiuk.

"Not one dime will come off the tax bills for the arena," Councillor Rick Day said. "There is nothing for the arena on the mill rate."

Site opponent Russ Saunders of Laurier Ave. wondered what will happen if not enough money can be raised locally to finance the arena. Treasurer Don Loughheed said the town can finance any dollar shortage, until the money is found.

Later in the meeting the treasurer indicated there are promises of some hefty pledges toward the public subscription fund. The total, he said, is "not for publication yet."

I.C.G. again calls for independent study

Members of Interested Citizen's Group, their lawyer Dick Howitt and MPP Julian Reed presented a brief to the Minister of Energy, James Taylor, on Monday, again calling for an independent study of the Bruce to Milton hydro corridor proposed by Ontario Hydro.

The Minister listened to them and the situation was discussed but there were no other visible results from the meeting. The ICG felt the recent decision by the Supreme Court of Ontario which acknowledged the Solandt Commission did not study the north-south route could influence the Minister's decision on the matter.

In a prepared release, Reed stated: "It is inconceivable to me" that if the Government is acting in good faith that it should refuse the study which should be completed in six months when the alternative will be even longer delays through unhappy citizens opposing the corridor at expropriation and by-law hearings. "Of course," Reed said, "if a majority Conservative government results

from the June 9th election, watch how quickly the Cabinet will pass an order-in-council pushing the corridor through despite the efforts of the interested Citizens Group and the provisions of the local zoning by-law. It is quite significant my Conservative opponent Mr. Gray has remained silent on the issue."

Mr. Gray has said Hydro must go somewhere and he would fight to ensure landowners got adequate compensation.
