Martin St. track team third in North Halton

Martin St. School track team placed third in the North Halton senior public schools' track meet at E. C. Drury School last Tuesday with 147 points.

The point total almost tripled last year's output for the school in the meet.

Centennial School from Georgetown won the competition with 214 points with Stewarttown closely behind with 210 points.

In the individual events 19 boys and 33 girls placed in the top five of their competitions. Derrick Neelands won the junior boys' 400 metres with a time of 68.2 seconds and finished second in the 60-metre hurdles with a time of 10.3 seconds.

In the junior boys' triple jump Tom Houston captured top honors with a jump of 8.57 metres and finished second in the long jump behind Graham Griffiths who jumped 7.98 metres.

In the senior boys' 400 metres Joe O'Grady set a North Halton record with a time of 60.2 seconds to win the race. O'Grady also jumped 4.42 metres in the long jump event to capture a third-place ribbon.

Another North Halton record was also set by a Martin St. runner as Tina Panter ran the intermediate girls' 400 metres in 68.7 seconds for the first-place ribbon. Panter also finished first in the 800 metres with a time of 2:37.8.

Janet Lasole led the junior girls' team with a first in the high jump (1.37 metres) and a third in the 60-metre hurdles with a time of 10.6 seconds. Evelyn Thompson won the junior girls' 800 metres with a time of two minutes and 51 seconds.

Sherry King captured the senior girls' shot put event with a distance of 9.34 metres. King also placed third in the 200 metres (30.7 seconds).

Other high finishers in the junior boys' events were Allen Brown, fourth in the 700 metres (2:44.1); Mike Stead-

man, fifth in the 800 metres (2:45.1); Scott Chudleigh fifth in the 200 metres (32.5 seconds) and Tom Haskett, fifth in the 400 metres (74.4 seconds).

Other top athletes in the junior girls' events were Tricia Riddell with a second in the 200 metres (32.0 seconds) and a third in the 60 metres (9.25 seconds); Terry Pullen with a second in the 400 metres (74.6 seconds); Cindy Scannell with a second in the girls' shot put (6.86 metres), and Lisa Koslowski with a fourth in the 400 metres (75.4 metres) and a fourth in the 800 metres (2:57.9).

In the intermediate boys' events Bob Hiepel was second in the 400 metres (65.1 seconds), Darrin Caputo second in the shot put (11.65 metres), David Heard fifth in the 80 metres (14.8 seconds), and Darrell McCullough third in the long jump (4.20 metres).

In the intermediate girls'

events Jackie Llewellyn was second in the 400 metres (70.2 seconds) and in the 800 metres (2:42.6) plus third in the 200 metres (31.1 seconds), Stacey Phillips second in the 200 metres (31 seconds), Barb Banner third in the long jump (3.93 metres), Debbie Knapp fourth in the shot put (8.69 metres) and Catherine Ronnebeck fourth in the high jump (1.35 metres).

In the senior boys' events Rod Bell was third in the 800 metres (2:26.9) and in the triple jump (9.60 metres), and Scott Richardson was second in the shot put (11.58).

Renee Nolet placed fifth in the senior girls' hurdles with a time of 14.9 seconds.

In the relay races Martin St. finished third overall with 28 points behind Stewarttown (36 points) and Centennial (32 points).

The school's only first place finish occurred in the junior boys' 4 x 100.

Hillsburgh beats Olympics 10-1

The Hillsburgh junior North Stars, behind the fourth-hitting of Tami Henderson brought the Milton Olympic three-game winning streak to an abrupt end, as they soundly defeated Milton by a 10-1 count, Sunday night in Hillsburgh.

A seven-run, fourth inning spelled the downfall for 17-year-old Donna Price in her first start for the Olympics.

Price showed strong future potential for the Milton club by allowing only seven hits over the game, striking out three North Stars and issuing five free passes.

The four Olympics' hits were recorded by Cathy Rusk, Sandi Snow, Jan

Vallier and Lynda Brooks. Henderson kept the Milton hitters off balance, with a high rising pitch, which caused them all kinds of trouble.

The Olympics return home Wednesday night to face the Glen Williams squad at Rotary Park, 8:45 p.m., before taking to the road for three consecutive away games, Thursday at Hornby, Monday at Georgetown and next Wednesday at Hillsburgh.

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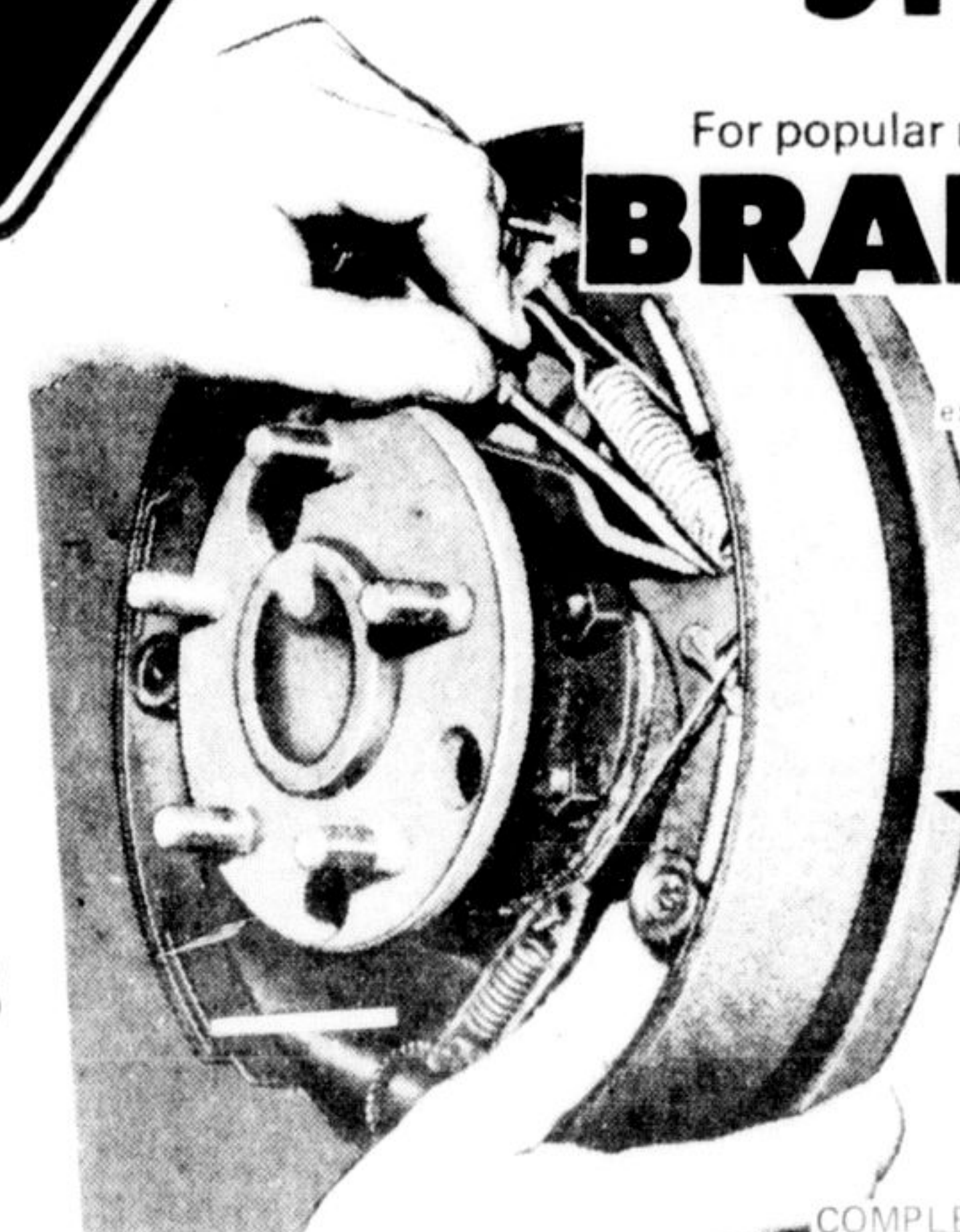
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
