Janice Warren, 16, of Corbeil in the Nipissing District, is the house guest of Dale Wickson, 15, Trafalgar Rd. Halton Hills. Janice is a grade 12 student and a member of Bonfield Flyers 4-H Club. She hopes to attend University of Guelph to study agriculture after finishing high school, and some day hopes to own her own farm.

Simpsons interchange

Montrealers friendly Milton teenager finds

The Simpsons-sponsored interchange for teenagers of its Quebec and Ontario employees was so successful that the program will likely be repeated and expanded in coming years, according to Tracy Kennedy of Milton, a participant in this summer's interchange.

Tracy, 14, is the step-daughter of G. Allan Burton of Walker's Line, Milton, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of Simpsons Limited. The exchange was Mr. Burton's idea and both he and his wife, broadcaster Betty Kennedy, were involved in the arrangements.

A total of 30 sons and daughters of Simpsons Quebec staff families and 30 of their counterparts from Simpsons in Ontario spent an

activity-filled week in Ontario followed by an equally eventful week in Quebec.

"In today's world the young people from different parts of our country must know and understand each other, or tomorrow's world will be divided," Mr. Burton commented when he announced the interchange, called "Between Friends/Entre Amis".

During the Ontario portion of the program the last week of June, Tracy was hostess to Elaine Dugas of Montreal. Continuing friendships were an outcome of the program, Tracy said. This winter she plans a skiing trip to the Laurentians with the Quebec

family with whom she stayed.

Not surprisingly, the rock concert by Pink Floyd at Montreal's Olympic Stadium and an Ian Thomas concert at Ontario Place were the highlights of the program for all the teenagers. The Quebec visitors were especially impressed with Toronto's CN Tower and Niagara Falls, Tracy said. The Quebec portion of the program included a trip to the Laurentians and two days in Quebec City, as well as time spent in Montreal.

"I really loved Quebec City," Tracy said. "I was amazed by the handcrafted things we saw in the old churches."

Tracy found Montreal natives friendlier than Torontonians.

"It was the people from Montreal who really got things going on the trip," she said.

Because the Montreal teenagers spoke English well, English was used most of the time, Tracy said.

The participants, most of whom were in the 14 to 16 year age group, were selected

to give a fair representation to all departments at Simpsons, Tracy said. There were more Quebec than Ontario applicants, she added.

The program in future years probably will include interchanges between teenagers from Ontario and those from other provinces in addition to Quebec, according to Tracy. She hopes the idea will catch on with other companies also.

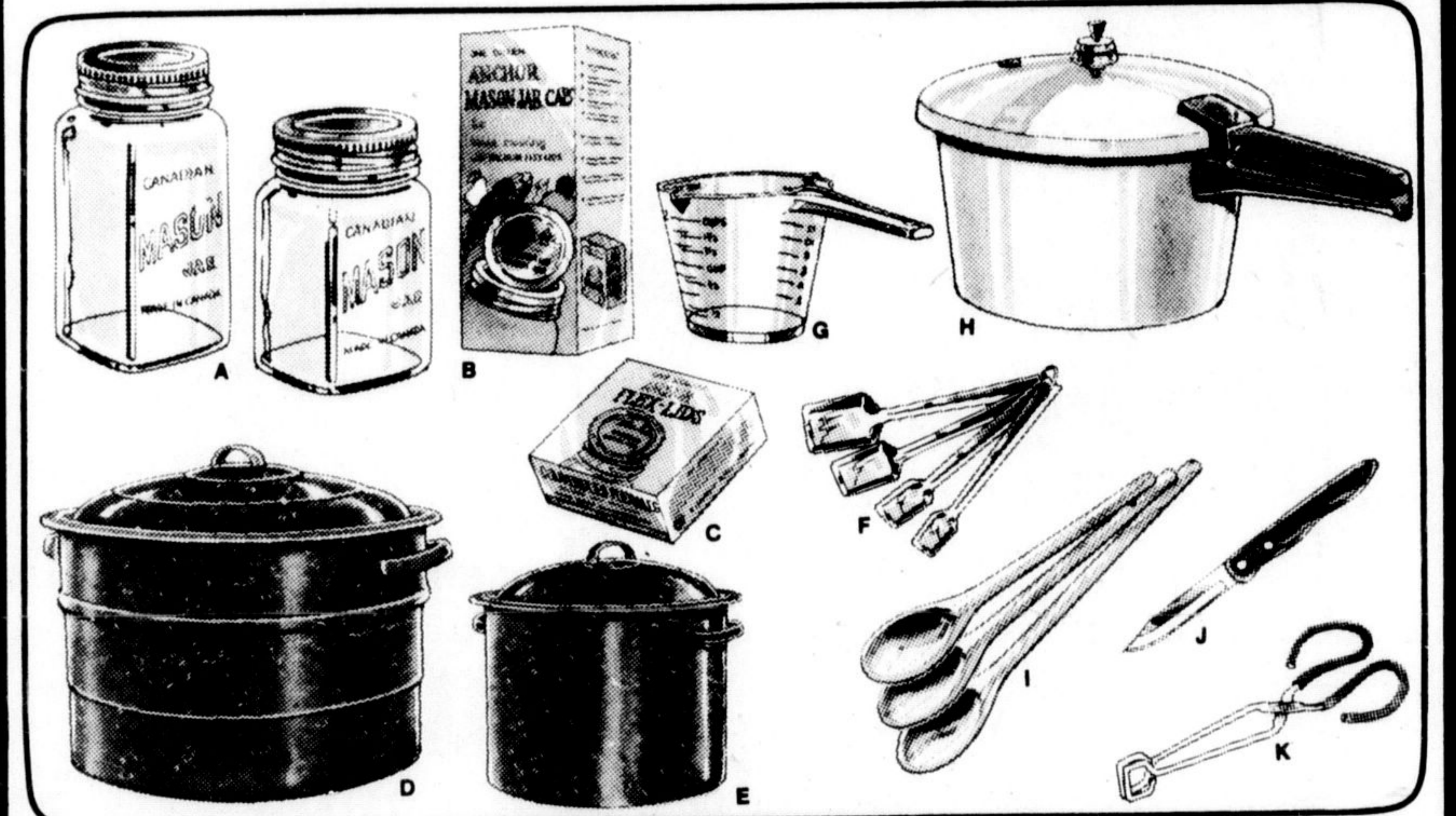
