cake. Being out to redeem themselves, the peewees made their mark early and at the 50 second mark Dave Willats

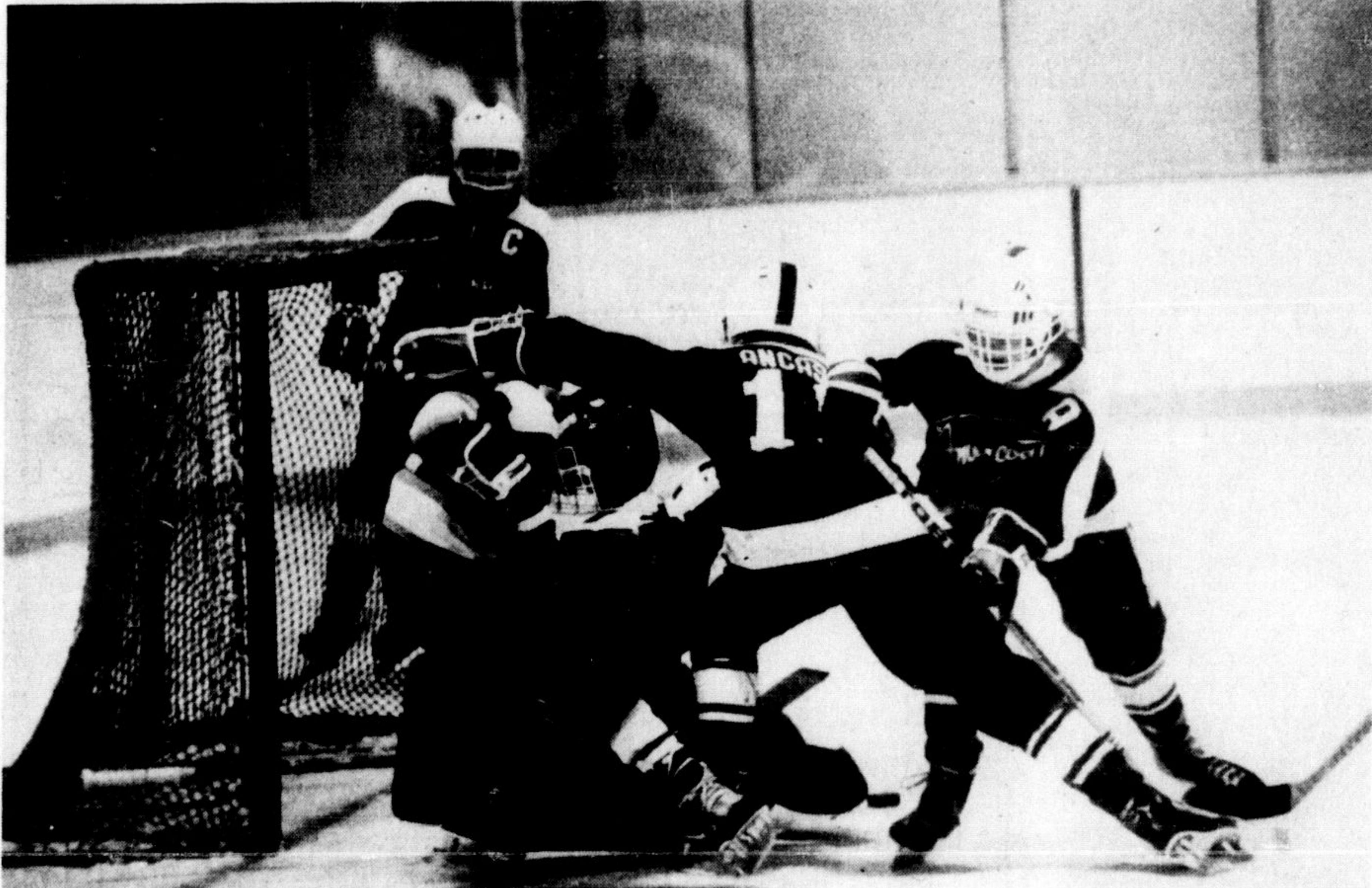
scooped up a loose puck in front of the Ancaster Royals net and fired it home. Bryan McIntosh and Bob Landry were in the play for assists.
