# Parade committee pleads for support

With only half of the funds collected to cover expenses of \$4,355 for this year's Milton Santa Claus Parade, the Parade Committee is very worried it will have to ask the Town of Milton for the necessary funds, according to Joyce Hagevik, publicity agent for the volunteer group.

"It should be a citizens' effort and not the Town's", Mrs. Hagevik stated emphatically. "It is for the kids' benefit, this parade, and yet we are really having problems in getting support for it," she said.

The nine member committee has collected to date \$2,021 in ticket sales for a draw featuring a color television, a Canadian Tire gift coupon of \$100 and a Christmas centrepiece, as well as donations from several Milton companies and service clubs.

"Many years ago, when the parade first started, the Milton Fire Department looked after arrangements for the parade, then the firemen and the Legion did it, but they stopped because of lack of support from the people," said Mrs. Hagevik.

With less than four weeks to go until the scheduled parade for Nov. 26, the Committee will likely go into debt or be forced to request money from the Town of Milton, stated Mrs. Hagevik.

The committee is planning for nine bands with the possibility of a 10th according to Karen Uryhn, chairman of the committee. "As well we have four majorette groups coming out, about 50 clowns, 16 registered floats, walking groups, horses and of course, Santa Claus."

One area parade committee members are expecting to generate a great deal of enthusiasm is the poster contest. The contest is being sponsored by the committee for grades one to five for area elementary schools. While the Christmas parade will feature a theme of "Christmas around the World", the posters may depict any type of Christmas scene, said Mrs. Hagevik.

The closing date for posters is Nov. 10 with judging to take place Nov. 19 at the Milton Mall, where the posters will be on display to the public. A trophy will be awarded to a child in each grade with the added bonus of a "Minnie Meal", being given to each winner from McDonald's. Root beer will also be freely distributed to all children participating and present on Nov. 19 at the Mall by A & W.

Judging the poster contest will be Mayor Don Wgordon, Rod Lewis, Barry Tonner, Karen Uryhn, and an art teacher from a public school.

The parade route will follow as in previous years, starting at 2 p.m. from Ernest C. Drury School, along Ontario St. and Main to Brown St. and finally into the Milton fair grounds.

Mayor Don Gordon will be present for the parade as the honorary marshal. Prizes for floats will be given to the best theme float, runner-up in best theme and for the most creative non-theme float. The trophies are on display in The Champion's window.

Judging will be Judy Hunter, Freda Best and Tom McCarron.

# Truck-car services questioned


Councillor Rick Day suggested Mr. Hasselfeldt should come to next week's council meeting and explain how the company will operate, and fellow councillors agreed.
